

THIS INSTRUMENT WITNESSETH: That we the undersigned persons have associated ourselves to establish a corporation for the transaction of the kind of business hereinafter set out.

- (1) The name of said corporation shall be Phoenix Oil Production Company
- (2) The principal office of said corporation shall be located in the city of Lexington, Ky.,
- (3) The nature of the business, objects and purposes proposed to be transacted, promoted and carried on, is as follows: To acquire by purchase or otherwise and to own lease, let, hold, oil, convey, develop, equip, maintain, operate and otherwise deal in and with land containing or believed to contain oil, petroleum, asphaltum, mineral gases, metals, creos, coal and other minerals and mineral substances; to prospect, search and explore for oil, petroleum, asphaltum, creos, coal, metals, mineral gases and mineral crust rocks; to lease, let, control, develop, equip, maintain and operate oil wells, pipelines or rights and interests therein; to buy, sell, hold, own and deal in oil, gas, coal and mineral royalties, leases, contracts, and options.

In furtherance and not in limitation of the general powers conferred by law it is expressly provided that this corporation shall also have the following powers: to purchase, take, own, hold, let, lease, mortgage or otherwise alien and to lease oil, asphaltum, creos, coal, and dispose of real property where ever with to such as may be necessary for the transaction of the business of said corporation; to enter into such and all contracts of every kind for any lawful purpose to any person, firm, association, or corporation, town, city, county, state, territory or government, to buy, sell or own, and deal in the stocks, bonds and obligations of the same when necessary in the course of the business of the said corporation.

To take up, adventure or claim titles to the same by contract from time to time in to have the same by corporate, plied, test or trust, or otherwise; to make, draw, sign, affix, endorse, disaffix, execute and issue promissory notes, drafts, bills of exchange, and other negotiable instruments in the usual course of business of this corporation so far as the law of Kentucky permits.

To purchase, hold and re-issue the shares of its capital stock.

To sue and be sued in the same manner as an individual.

(4) The amount of the capital stock of the said corporation shall be the sum of \$50,000.00 divided into 500 shares of the denomination of \$100.00 each which said shares of stock shall be full paid and non-assessable.

(5) The names and places of residence of each of the stockholders and the number of shares subscribed by each is as follows:

(6) Said corporation shall commence business on the 8th day of October, 1917, and shall continue for a period of twenty years unless previously dissolved by law.

(7) The affairs of said corporation are to be conducted by the following officers and persons to-wit: By a President, Vice-President, Secretary, Treasurer and Manager; provided that the office of Secretary and Treasurer may in the discretion of the Board of Directors be held by one and the same person, and that the office of Vice-president and Manager may be held by one and the same person in like manner; and said corporation shall have a board of directors selected from stockholders ~~five~~ in number; and all officers and directors of said company shall be elected annually on the first Monday in October.

(8) The highest amount of indebtedness or liability which the said corporation may at any time incur shall be the sum of \$25,000.00.

(9) The private property of the stockholders, not subject by the provisions of the law under which it is organized, shall not be subject to the payment of the debts of said corporation.


Inclosed please find check for FIFTY DOLLARS payable to State Treasurer in payment of the organization tax for the Phoenix Oil Production Company.
