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

279	1. Chapters shall be organized in accordance with state organization bylaws.
280	Each chapter so organized shall have no fewer than twelve (12) members. The
281	Society shall grant the charter.

284	time of installation of the chapter. Any member who transfers her membership to the new chapter at the time of its installation becomes a charter member of
