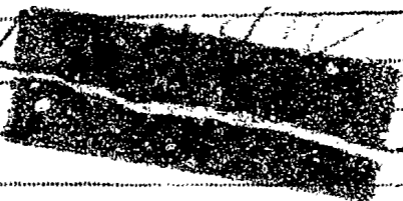

Articles of Incorporation of Society of the  
Sons of the Revolution in the State of Kentucky.

We

Citizens and residents of the State of Kentucky do hereby form a corporation under the provision of Chapter 32 of the present General Statutes of the State of Kentucky:-

- (1) The name of the corporation shall be Sons of the Revolution in Kentucky.
- (2) The principal office place of business shall be in Lexington, Fayette County, Kentucky.
- (3) The objects of the corporation are Social and Patriotic to perpetuate among their descendants the memory of the brave men who periled their lives and interests in the War of the Revolution to wrest the American Colonies from British Dominion.
- (4) The corporation shall not issue any Capital Stock.
- (5) The corporation shall commence when these articles are filed and recorded as provided by law and shall continue 25 years.
- (6) The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Managers consisting of eight members, who shall be chosen annually at a meeting of the members of the corporation to be held on the 19th., day of April in each year at its principal office

in Lexington, Kentucky. The corporators shall constitute the first Board of Managers and shall hold office until their successors are chosen. the Board shall appoint a President and Secretary of the Company and such other offices as they may deem proper, who shall hold their respective offices until their successors are appointed, subject to removal by the Board.

(7) The amount amount of indebtedness or liability which the Corporation shall at any time incur, is \$
