

AMENDMENT TO ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

CONSENT IN WRITING

We, the undersigned, being the owners of more than two-thirds of the capital stock of Jellico Grocery Company, of Williamsburg, Whitley County, Kentucky, do hereby consent in writing that Article IV of the Articles of Incorporation, which is in words as follows:

"The amount of capital stock is \$300,000.00, divided into 3000 shares of the value of \$100.00 per share, and all of said shares of stock have been in good faith subscribed".

may be amended to read as follows:

"The amount of the capital stock of Jellico Grocery Company shall be and is \$750,000.00, divided into 7500 shares of the value of \$100.00 each, and more than fifty per cent (50%) of the capital stock has in good faith been subscribed."

And that Article VIII, which is in words as follows:

"The highest amount of indebtedness and liability that the corporation may at any time incur shall not exceed \$200,000.00".

"The highest amount of indebtedness or liability that the corporation may at any time incur shall not exceed \$500,000.00".

We, the undersigned, A. T. Siler, President of Jellico Grocery Company, U. S. Jones, M. V. Siler, W. M. Ellison and A. T. Siler, being a majority (four out of seven) of the directors of Jellico Grocery Company, a corporation organized under the laws of the State of Kentucky, July 2, 1912, hereby certify that the stockholders whose names are signed to the consent in writing on the first and second pages of this amendment, represent 2063 shares out of a total of 3000 shares of the capital stock of Jellico Grocery Company, which is more than two-thirds of said stock.

Now, therefore, we, as a majority of the directors of the said Jellico Grocery Company, desiring to carry out the will and consent of the stockholders, as explained in the first page of this amendment, do hereby change Article IV and Article VIII of the Articles of Incorporation of said corporation, and amend and adopt same so as to read as follows:

#### ARTICLE IV

"The amount of the capital stock of Jellico Grocery Company shall be and is \$750,000.00, divided into 7500 shares of the value of \$100.00 each, and more than fifty per cent (50%) of the capital stock has in good faith been subscribed".

#### ARTICLE VIII.

"The highest amount of indebtedness or liability that the corporation may at any time incur shall not exceed \$500,000.00".




