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ADDITIONAL PROVISIONS TO

AMENDED ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION OF WSOS COMMUNITY ACTION COMMISSION, INC.

THIRD: The corporation is organized to operate exclusively for charitable and educational purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or corresponding provision of any future United States Internal Revenue law), as amended, and more specifically:

- (a) To collect and analyze data on the incidence and nature of poverty in Seneca County and that part of Fostoria which lies in Hancock County, Sandusky County and that part of Bellevue which lies in Erie and Huron Counties, Ottawa County and Wood County, all of said counties being in the State of Ohio, which territory shall be known as the "W.S.O.S. area;" identify sub areas and groups where problems of poverty are concentrated; define major problems which require community action; and clarify objectives of attack upon such problems;
- (b) To analyze existing public and private agencies and services concerned with the problems of poverty and determine strategy and methods of fuller mobilization of public and private resources for support of community action efforts;
- (c) To stimulate, participate in and encourage programs for providing services, assistance, and other activities, with maximum possible involvement of people to be benefited, toward developing employment and economic opportunities, improving human performance, individual and group motivation, and productivity, and bettering conditions under which people live, learn and work;
- (d) To foster action planning for community service programs and plan and participate with local governments and other public, private and voluntary agencies or groups for the mobilization of required financial and other resources to participate in funding which may be available for such programs and for strengthening basic community services;
- (e) To develop and evaluate action plan proposals, participate with and foster cooperation among appropriate functional agencies, entities and groups, public and private, for implementation of specific action programs recommended and approved as components of a community action program or otherwise determined by the corporation's Directors to be in furtherance of the corporation's purposes and functions, including, but not limited to, programs for the provision, acquisition, construction, ownership, leasing, redevelopment or development of housing and housing related resources;
- (f) To serve as the principal public non-profit agency in the W.S.O.S. area for the solicitation of and the contracting for Federal funds available under the Economic Opportunity Act of 1964, as amended; and act as a fiscal agent for the utilization and application of Federal funds and other governmental and voluntary funds made available, either through subcontracting with appropriate operating organizations or agencies, or by establishing necessary administrative structures or organizations for the purpose;

- (g) To exercise any and all general corporate powers expressly or impliedly, granted by the laws of the State of Ohio to non-profit corporations in furthering any and all of the above general and specific purposes and functions;
- (h) To provide financial and other assistance to other communities, community organizations, voluntary associations and other entities that undertake similar activities as those described above for the benefit of residents in their territory, whether their territory includes some, none or all of the W.S.O.S. area; and,
- (i) To (1) solicit, receive and administer funds for educational and charitable purposes and, to that end, (2) take and hold by bequest, devise, gift, grant, purchase, lease or otherwise, either absolutely or jointly with another tax exempt organization or governmental entity, any property, real, personal, tangible or intangible, or any undivided interest therein, without limitation as to the amount of value, (3) sell, convey or otherwise dispose of any such property and (4) invest, reinvest and otherwise deal with the principal or the income thereof in such manner as, in the judgment of the corporation's Directors, will best promote the purposes of the corporation without limitation, except such limitation, if any, as may be contained in the instrument under which such property is received, the Code of Regulations of the corporation or any laws applicable thereto.

In addition, in furtherance of the purposes described in the immediately preceding subparagraphs lettered (a) through (i):

The corporation shall not carry on propaganda or otherwise attempt to influence legislation except as an insubstantial part of its activities. The corporation shall not engage in any transaction or permit any act or omission that could operate to deprive it of its tax-exempt status under Section 501(c)(3) of the Code. The corporation shall not in any manner or to any extent participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements), any political campaign on behalf of any candidate for public office; nor shall it engage in any "prohibited transaction" as defined in Section 503(b) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986.

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of any member of the corporation or other private individual, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered to it. None of the property of the corporation shall be distributed directly or indirectly to any member of the corporation, except in fulfillment of its charitable and educational purposes enumerated in subparagraphs lettered (a) through (i), above.

In the event of dissolution or liquidation of the corporation, any assets remaining shall be distributed among such other organization(s) as shall qualify at the time as an exempt organization described in Code Section 501(c)(3) as the Trustees shall determine, such assets to be used for purposes consistent with those described in subparagraphs (a) through (i), above.

The corporation shall also have such powers as are now or may hereinafter be granted under the laws of the State of Ohio that are in furtherance of the corporation's exempt purposes within the meaning of Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code of 1986 (or the corresponding section of any future federal tax codes), as amended.
