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ARTICLES OF INCORPORATION

OF

KENTUCKIANA MUSICIANS FOR THE COMMUNITY, INC.

We, the undersigned, a majority of whom are citizens of the United States, having associated for the purpose of forming a non-profit, non-stock corporation under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, more particularly KRS Chapter 14A and KRS Chapter 273, hereby certify:

ARTICLE I

The name of the Corporation is Kentuckiana Musicians for the Community, Inc.

ARTICLE II

The duration of the corporation is perpetual.

ARTICLE III

Said corporation is organized exclusively for charitable and educational purposes, for the presentation, facilitation and education of live music in underserved communities without the internal resources to sponsor such events. Communities could include schools, nursing and retirement homes, libraries, public parks and civic events.

Music would be presented to communities at no cost for events free and open to the public.

ARTICLE IV

The registered agent of the corporation is Anthony Minstein. The address of the registered office is 1436 Bardstown Road, Louisville, Kentucky 40204.

ARTICLE V

The principal office of the Corporation is 1436 Bardstown Road, Louisville, Jefferson County, Kentucky 40204.

ARTICLE VIII

In carrying out the corporate purposes described in Article III, the corporation will have all the powers granted by the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, including in particular those listed in KRS 273.171 (or corresponding provision of any future state statute), except as follows and as otherwise stated in these Articles:

No part of the net earnings of the corporation shall inure to the benefit of, or be distributable to its members, directors, officers, or other private persons, except that the corporation shall be authorized and empowered to pay reasonable compensation for services rendered and to make payments and distributions in furtherance of the purposes set forth in Article III hereof.

No substantial part of the activities of the corporation shall be the carrying on of propaganda, or otherwise attempting to influence legislation, and the corporation shall not participate in, or intervene in (including the publishing or distribution of statements) any political campaign on behalf of or in opposition to any candidate for public office.

Notwithstanding any other provision of these articles, the corporation shall not carry on any other activities not permitted to be carried on (a) by a corporation exempt from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or (b) by a corporation, contributions to which are deductible under section 170(c)(2) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code.

ARTICLE IX

Upon the dissolution of the corporation, assets shall be distributed for one or more exempt purposes within the meaning of section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, or the corresponding section of any future federal tax code, or shall be distributed to the federal government, or to a state or local government, for a public purpose. Any such assets not so disposed of shall be disposed of by a Court of Competent Jurisdiction of the county in which the principal office of the corporation is then located, exclusively for such purposes or to such organization or organizations, as said Court shall determine, which are organized and operated exclusively for such purposes.

ARTICLE X

This instrument shall be effective as of the date and time of filing.


