STATE OF EMERGENCY

Beginning on April 1, 2024, and continuing, a severe weather system containing heavy rain, hail, continuous cloud-to-ground lightning, tornadoes, and intense damaging winds impacted the Commonwealth, creating dangerous conditions, including flash flooding, tornadic impacts to structures, and potential mudslides which caused damage to public infrastructure, utility distribution systems, and private properties;

These conditions endanger public health and safety and/or public and private property;

State and local governments share responsibility for protection of public health, safety, and security as well as for the protection of public and private property and for taking appropriate actions to ensure the provision of essential public services;

On April 2, 2024, I declared by Executive Order 2024-269 that a State of Emergency existed in the Commonwealth of Kentucky;

On May 2, 2024, at the request of two County Judge/Executives, two City Mayors and one Mayor of a consolidated local government that the state of emergency be extended through May 31, 2024, I declared by Executive Order 2024-320 that a state of emergency continued in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and extended Executive Order 2024-269 through May 31, 2024 for all local jurisdictions that requested the extension. At the request of the Clark County, Kentucky Judge/Executive, I also extended Executive order 2024-269 through July 31, 2024;

On June 1, 2024, at the request of two County Judge/Executives, two City Mayors and one Mayor of a consolidated local government that the state of emergency be extended through July 31, 2024;

Under KRS 39A.090(2)(b), the state of emergency declared under Executive Order 2024-269 may exceed 30 days if requested by a chief executive officer or a legislative body of a local government only for that local government and only for the period of time requested by the chief executive officer or legislative body;

The Bath County Judge/Executive has written a letter requesting that I extend the state of emergency under Executive Order 2024-269, as extended by Executive Order 2024-320 and Executive Order 2024-390, through August 31, 2024. This letter is attached to this executive order and is adopted and incorporated by reference herein;

The State of Emergency continues;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of Kentucky and by KRS Chapter 39A and KRS 151.200, do hereby declare that a State of Emergency continues to exist in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and do hereby Order and Direct that Executive Order 2024-269, as extended through Executive Order 2024-320 and Executive Order 2024-390, be extended through August 31, 2024 in the following local jurisdiction:

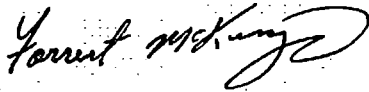
