STATE OF EMERGENCY

Beginning on May 26, 2024, and continuing, a powerful severe weather system generating heavy rain, tornadoes, large hail, continuous cloud-to-cloud lightning and intense damaging winds impacted the Commonwealth of Kentucky, creating dangerous conditions, including flooding, flash flooding, mudslides, landslides, and subsequent damage to public infrastructure, utility distribution systems, and private properties;

These conditions endanger public health and safety and/or public and private property;

State and local governments share responsibility for protection of public health, safety, and security as well as for the protection of public and private property and for taking appropriate actions to ensure the provision of essential public services;

On May 26, 2024, I declared by Executive Order 2024-379 that a State of Emergency existed in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. On that same day, I signed Executive Order 2024-380 to declare a State of Emergency to implement the provisions of KRS 367.372, *et seq.*, to prohibit price gouging as to the sale of goods and services related to the May 26, 2024, and continuing, severe weather event, and I renewed implementation of those statutory provisions in Executive Order 2024-418 on June 10, 2024;

Under KRS 39A.090(2)(b), the State of Emergency declared under Executive Order 2024-379 may exceed 30 days if requested by a chief executive officer or a legislative body of a local government only for that local government and only for the period of time requested by the chief executive officer or legislative body;

On June 25, 2024, at the request of 47 County Judge/Executives, six City Mayors and one Mayor of a consolidated local government that the state of emergency and certain emergency actions taken under it be extended through September 30, 2024, I declared by Executive Order 2024-446 that a state of emergency continued in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and extended the following through September 30, 2024: Executive Order 2024-379 and Executive Order 2024-380 as extended by Executive Order 2024-418.

On September 30, 2024, at the request of 32 County Judge/Executives, six City Mayors, and one Mayor of a consolidated local government that the state of emergency and certain emergency actions taken under it be extended through January 15, 2025, I declared by Executive Order 2024-648 that a state of emergency continued in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and extended the following through January 15, 2025: Executive Order 2024-379 and Executive Order 2024-380, as extended by Executive Order 2024-418.

Seventeen County Judge/Executives, one City Mayor, and one Mayor of a consolidated local government have written letters requesting that I extend the state of emergency under Executive Order 2024-379, as well as Executive Order 2024-380 as extended by Executive Order 2024-418, as extended by Executive Order 2024-446 and Executive Order 2024-648, through June 30, 2025. These letters are attached to this executive order and are adopted and incorporated by reference herein;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Constitution of Kentucky and by KRS Chapter 39A and KRS 151.200, do hereby declare that a State of Emergency continues to exist in the Commonwealth of Kentucky, and do hereby Order and Direct that Executive Order 2024-379, and Executive Order 2024-380 as extended by Executive Order 2024-418, as extended by Executive Order 2024-446 and Executive Order 2024-648, be extended through June 30, 2025 in the following local jurisdictions:
