STATE OF EMERGENCY

Beginning on February 15, 2025, and continuing, a severe weather event with heavy and torrential rain, flooding and landslides impacted the Commonwealth and created dangerous travel and road conditions and caused damage to public infrastructure, utility distribution systems, and private properties.

These conditions endangered public health and safety and/or public and private property.

State and local governments share responsibility for protection of public health, safety, and security as well as for the protection of public and private property and for taking appropriate actions to ensure the provision of essential public services.

On February 14, 2025, I declared by Executive Order 2025-095 that a State of Emergency existed in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. On that same day, I signed Executive Order 2025-096 to declare a State of Emergency to implement the provisions of KRS 367.372, *et seq.*, to prohibit price gouging as to the sale of goods and services related to the February 15, 2025, and continuing, severe weather event, and I renewed implementation of those statutory provisions in Executive Order 2025-135 on February 28, 2025, effective March 3, 2025.

On February 16, 2025, President Donald J. Trump approved a an Major Disaster Area Declaration for Kentucky, EM-3624-KY. On February 24, 2025, President Donald J. Trump also approved a Major Disaster Area Declaration and Individual and Public Assistance, FEMA-DR-4860-KY for certain Kentucky counties. Major Disaster Area Declaration FEMA-DR-4860-KY has been and continues to be amended to designate additional counties for assistance.

Under KRS 39A.090(2)(b), the state of emergency declared under Executive Order 2025-095 may exceed 30 days if requested by a chief executive officer or a legislative body of a local government only for that local government and only for the period of time requested by the chief executive officer or legislative body.

Forty-eight (48) County Judge/Executives, 19 City Mayors, and one Mayor of a Consolidated Local Government have written letters requesting that I extend the State of Emergency under Executive Order 2025-095 and the State of Emergency under Executive Order 2025-096, as extended by Executive Order 2025-135, through January 15, 2026. These letters are attached to this executive order and are adopted and incorporated by reference herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kentucky Constitution and KRS Chapter 39A, do hereby declare a State of Emergency exists in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and do hereby **ORDER** and **DIRECT** that Executive Order 2025-095, and Executive Order 2025-096, as extended by Executive Order 2025-135, be extended through January 15, 2026 in the following local jurisdictions:

AMENDED STATE OF EMERGENCY

Beginning on February 15, 2025, and continuing, a severe weather event with heavy and torrential rain, flooding and landslides impacted the Commonwealth and created dangerous travel and road conditions and caused damage to public infrastructure, utility distribution systems, and private properties.

These conditions endangered public health and safety and/or public and private property.

State and local governments share responsibility for protection of public health, safety, and security as well as for the protection of public and private property and for taking appropriate actions to ensure the provision of essential public services.

On February 14, 2025, I declared by Executive Order 2025-095 that a State of Emergency existed in the Commonwealth of Kentucky. On that same day, I signed Executive Order 2025-096 to declare a State of Emergency to implement the provisions of KRS 367.372, *et seq.*, to prohibit price gouging as to the sale of goods and services related to the February 15, 2025, and continuing, severe weather event, and I renewed implementation of those statutory provisions in Executive Order 2025-135 on February 28, 2025, effective March 3, 2025.

On February 16, 2025, President Donald J. Trump approved a Major Disaster Area Declaration for Kentucky, EM-3624-KY. On February 24, 2025, President Donald J. Trump also approved a Major Disaster Area Declaration and Individual and Public Assistance, FEMA-DR-4860-KY for certain Kentucky counties. Major Disaster Area Declaration FEMA-DR-4860-KY has been and continues to be amended to designate additional counties for assistance.

Under KRS 39A.090(2)(b), the state of emergency declared under Executive Order 2025-095 may exceed 30 days if requested by a chief executive officer or a legislative body of a local government only for that local government and only for the period of time requested by the chief executive officer or legislative body.

Forty-nine (49) County Judge/Executives, 20 City Mayors, and one Mayor of a Consolidated Local Government have written letters requesting that I extend the State of Emergency under Executive Order 2025-095 and the State of Emergency under Executive Order 2025-096, as extended by Executive Order 2025-135, through January 15, 2026. These letters are attached to this executive order and are adopted and incorporated by reference herein.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Andy Beshear, Governor of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, by virtue of the authority vested in me by the Kentucky Constitution and KRS Chapter 39A, do hereby declare a State of Emergency exists in the Commonwealth of Kentucky and do hereby ORDER and DIRECT that Executive Order 2025-095, and Executive Order 2025-096, as extended by Executive Order 2025-135, be extended through January 15, 2026 in the following local jurisdictions:
