

BY CITIZENS AND RESIDENT VOTERS OF  
CALVERT CITY, KENTUCKY, INCORPORATED  
AS A TOWN OF THE SIXTH-CLASS.

This day this cause coming on regularly for hearing and trial and the same being submitted to the Court upon the pleadings and exhibits filed and upon the report of the Special Commissioner heretofore appointed by this Court, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that a majority of the legal voters of the town of Calvert City in Marshall County, a town heretofore incorporated as a Sixth-class town, after filing with this Court their petition praying that the incorporation and charter of Calvert City as a town of the Sixth-class be annulled; and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the purpose of said petition has been fully and properly advertised according to law; and it appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that all persons concerned and all elected officers of Calvert City are properly before the Court upon this petition in all respects required by law; and the Court being sufficiently advised in the whole case, doth order and adjudge as follows:

1....It is ordered and adjudged by this Court that the status of Calvert City, Marshall County, Kentucky, as an incorporated municipality under the laws of the State of Kentucky as a town of the Sixth-class be fully and finally annulled and its status as an incorporated town of the State of Kentucky as shown by the judgment and orders of this Court on the 27 day of March 1946, which judgment of incorporation as

ate shall be and is wholly void, annulled and of no effect. and the citizens and residents in the following boundaries being the boundaries as set out in the judgment incorporated in this opinion, to-wit:

beginning at a point on the north side of the school road at the intersection of the school road with the old Calvert City and Gilbertsville road; thence south on the west side of said road to a point opposite the Joe Houston and Dr. L. E. Smith corner; thence, East with Joe Houston and Dr. L. E. Smith line to a stake; thence South with a small ditch to the south right-of-way line of the I. C. R. R. Crossing the R. R. at a small sewer; thence West with said right-of-way to Shermell Street; thence south with Shermell Street to the south line of H. H. Kunnecke; thence East with Kunnecke's south line crossing the Calvert City and Big Cypress WPA road and intersecting the line between O. C. Oakley and the north line of Tennessee Valley Land Company Addition No. 3 of Calvert City; and continuing east to the east line of said Addition No. 3; thence south with the east line of said Addition No. 3 to a point, when turned west would be opposite the south line of Z. B. Hall; thence, west crossing the Calvert City and Big Cypress WPA road and with the south line of Z. B. Hall and continuing west to a point, when turned north would intersect State Street in the Tennessee Valley Land Company Addition No. 1 to Calvert City, Ky.; thence, north intersecting State Street and continuing north with State Street to a point 50 feet north of the south line of said Addition No. 1, to Calvert City, Ky.; thence, west to the East right-of-way line of Highway No. 95; thence north with said right-of-way line to a point opposite the corner of Claude Dees yard; thence west with the south line of Claude Dees yard and continuing west to a point in Claude Dees' field that when turned north would intersect the west line of T. W. Holland, a point 150 feet west of Boulard Street; with a small hawthorn tree as a line tree; thence north crossing the Calvert City and Paducah Road and intersecting west line of T. W. Holland yard, continuing north to the south line of the I. C. R. R. right-of-way; thence, east with said right-of-way line to Birdwell Street; thence north crossing the Railroad property and intersecting the west line of W. H. Roberts, continuing north to 150 feet north of Satterfield Street; thence east across the S. L. Goodloe property to the east right-of-way to the north side of school road; thence east with the north line of school road to the beginning.

unincorporated community or village.

2....It is the judgment of this Court that the cost of this proceeding shall be, and is, adjudged equally against the petitioners and the persons who appeared by petition requesting the proceeding, or seeking the removal of their names as petitioners.

3.... It is the order of this Court that the Special Commissioner, Bryan Holland, be, and he is allowed the sum of Twenty-five Dollars (\$25) as compensation for his service as Commissioner, which sum shall be taxed as a part of the cost.

4.... The Clerk of this Court is directed to certify to the Secretary of State the judgment of this Court annulling the incorporation of Calvert City, Marshall County, Kentucky.

For further orders not inconsistent herewith, this cause is left open.
