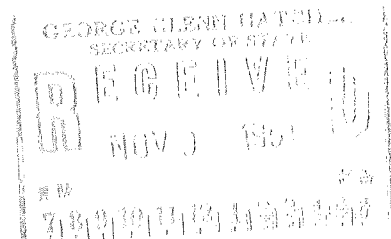

MARSHALL CIRCUIT COURT

IN THE MATTER OF:

PETITION FOR THE INCORPORATION OF
CALVERT CITY, MARSHALL COUNTY, KY.

J U D G M E N T

This day came the petitioners, by counsel, and filed herein the affidavit of W. B. Holland, Circuit Court Clerk, showing that notice of filing the petition herein, and its object, had been published in the issue of October 4th, 1951, and October 11th, 1951, of the Marshall Courier, a newspaper of general circulation published in Marshall County, Kentucky; and that notices of the filing of said petition and its object were posted, one at the courthouse door in the City of Benton, Kentucky and one at Paul St. service station, Calvert City, Kentucky, and one at the postoffice at Calvert City, Kentucky, and one at the Calvert Bank, Calvert City, Kentucky, and that each and all of the three last named places are public places within the area proposed to be incorporated; and it further appearing that the Commissioner heretofore appointed by the Court has filed his report herein it is now ordered that the report of said Commissioner be and the same is hereby confirmed;

And inasmuch as it appears that the petition herein is signed by more than two-thirds of the voters living within the boundary of the proposed municipality and that said petition was filed more than twenty days before the commencement of the present term of this Court, and that more than 125 inhabitants reside within the boundaries of said municipality, and that said boundary of the proposed municipality does not extend more than one-half (one-half) mile in each direction and that the form thereof is approximately square, that publication of notice of the filing of the petition and its object has been made by publication in two issues of a newspaper of general circulation in Marshall County as required by law, ~~and that no defense has been interposed hereby~~

And the Court having considered the pleadings, affidavit; and the Commissioners report, and being further fully advised now Orders and Adjudges:

That the following described territory be, and it is now hereby established as a city of the sixth class with all the powers and authority authorized by the Constitution and statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky to be hereinafter known as Galvert City:

Beginning at a point in the right of way of the Illinois Central Railroad, owner or lessee, which point of beginning is nine hundred fifty (950') feet, more or less, westerly of the center line of crossing of Kentucky State Highway Route 95,

Thence S. 3 deg. 00' W.	1650 feet to a point;
thence S. 87 deg. 00' E.	2640 feet to an iron pin
thence, N. 3 deg. 00' E.	2640 feet to a point
thence, N. 87 deg. 00' W.	2640 feet to a point
thence, S. 3 deg. 00' W.	990 feet to the point of

beginning. Forming a square of land one-quarter of one square mile in area

It is further ordered that G. Elvis Clayton, A. P. Harrell, Ray Hall, W. A. Doybe and Edward O'Dell be and they are hereby appointed as Trustees of Galvert City; that T. D. Fooks, be and he is now hereby appointed as Police Judge; that C. E. Atnip, be, and he is now hereby appointed as Marshall; and that Boyce Karnes, be, and he is hereby appointed as Assessor of Galvert City; and that each of said officers shall hold their respective offices until the next regular election at which officers for cities of the sixth class may be elected, and until their successors shall have been elected and qualified.

It is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court be, and he is now hereby directed to certify within ten days after the date of this judgment, a copy of this judgment to the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky at Frankfort, Kentucky, in order that the same may be properly indexed and filed as a permanent record in this office.
