
Dear Sir:

The City of Cold Spring, Kentucky is a Fifth Class City located in Campbell County, Kentucky. The City was incorporated by the Campbell Circuit Court sitting in regular session on March 18, 1941, the Honorable Ray L. Murphy Judge presiding. A copy of the Order is attached for your reference.

Its present boundaries are set out on the photocopy of the official map of the City which is also attached.

COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY  
CAMPBELL CIRCUIT COURT  
IN RE: INCORPORATION OF COLD SPRING

This cause being submitted on petitioners motion for judgment, and the court being satisfied from the pleadings, the petition signed by the residents and from a map of the territory filed herein, that the boundaries of said town do not exceed one-half mile in any direction, and the form of said town being a square; that there are one hundred fifty-nine (159) inhabitants. There are ninety-nine (99) qualified voters, and that more than two-thirds ( $2/3$ ) of said qualified voters have petitioned for said incorporation; that notice of the filing of said petition for incorporation has been posted for more than thirty (30) days at the door of the court house at Newport and at the court house at Alexandria and at three public places within the boundaries of the proposed town, and also by advertisement of the same in two issues of the Kentucky Post, a daily newspaper of general circulation of Campbell County, and there having been no objection made to said incorporation, and the court being fully advised;

It is hereby decreed that there be and there is hereby established and incorporated a town in the county of Campbell, Commonwealth of Kentucky, which town shall be named "Cold Spring" and the boundaries of which shall be as follows:

Beginning at a point in the Center Line of State and Federal Highway No. 27 as constructed at Station 167.35 as shown by plans on file at the office of the State Highway Department, Frankfort, Kentucky; where the Center Line of the Youtsey and Murman County Road intersect; thence running South  $52^{\circ} 45'$  West, Five Hundred and Forty (540) feet to a point; thence North  $37^{\circ} 15'$  West, twenty-six hundred and Forty (2640) feet, to a point;

thence North 52° 45' East, Twenty Six  
Hundred and Forty (2640) feet, to a point;  
thence South 37° 15' East Twenty Six Hun-  
dred and Forty (2640) feet to a point;  
thence south 52° 45' West, Twenty-one  
Hundred (2100) feet, to the place of  
beginning, and being one half mile square,  
containing 160 acres.

It is further ordered and decreed that the following  
be and that they are hereby appointed officers of said town  
to hold certain offices until the next election at which  
officials for cities and towns in this state may be elected, to  
wit;

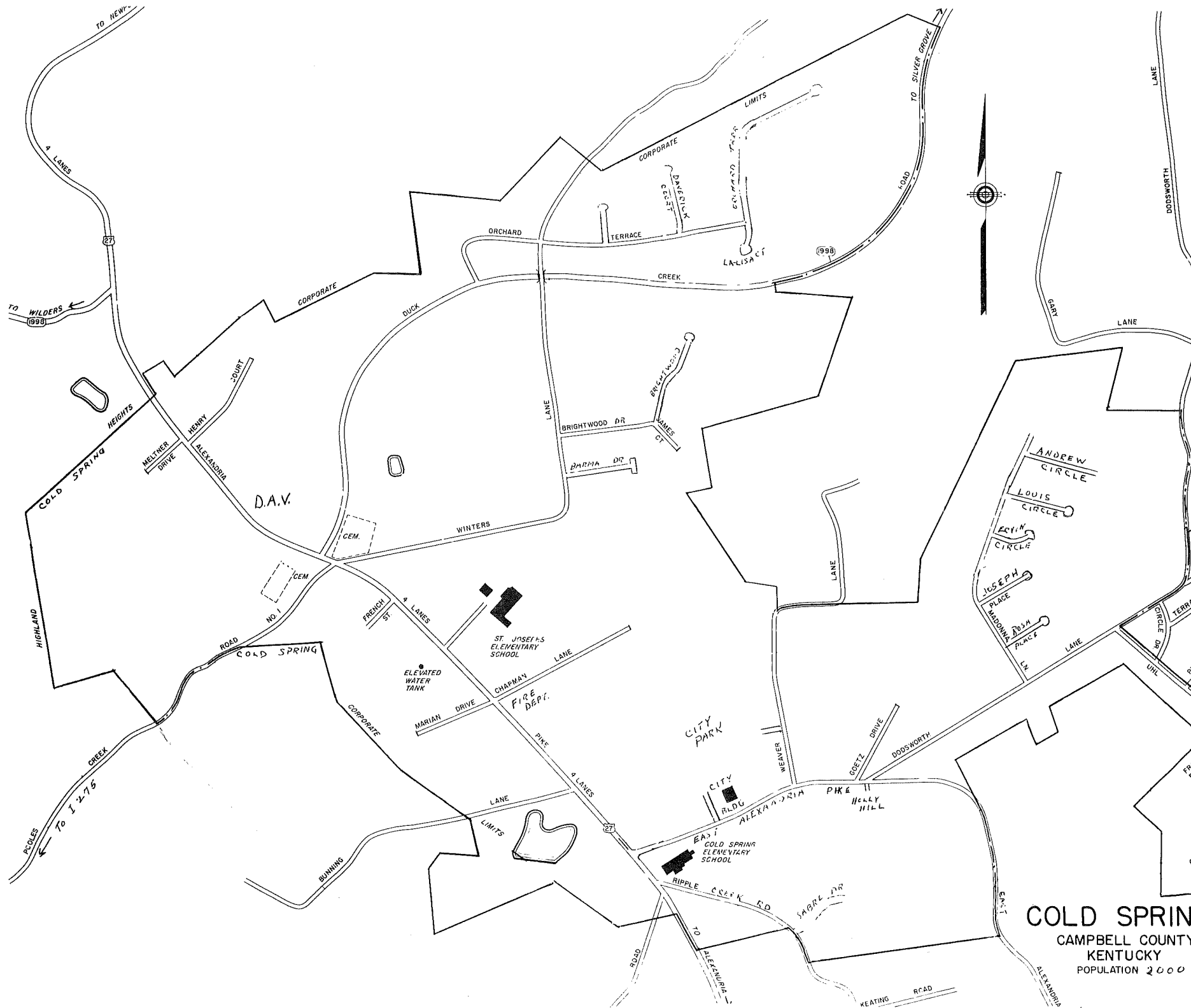
