COMMONWEALTH OF KENTUCKY CITY OF COLD SPRING ORDINANCE NO. 03-824

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING CERTAIN UNINCORPORATED TERRITORIES WITHIN THE COUNTY OF CAMPBELL, KENTUCKY AND CONTIGUOUS TO THE PRESENT BOUNDARY LINES OF THE CITY OF COLD SPRING, KENTUCKY, A CITY OF THE FIFTH CLASS AND DEFINING BY METES AND BOUNDS THE TERRITORY ANNEXED

WHEREAS, Kentucky Revised Statute 81A.410 authorizes and delegates city legislative bodies the authority to annex territories; and

WHEREAS, Kentucky Revised Statute 81A.412 provides the manner in which said annexation should be accomplished through the consent of the property owner; and

WHEREAS, the property owner, by way of an annexation agreement, has provided written consent to the annexation; and

WHEREAS, the property herein described is adjacent to and contiguous to the city's boundaries; and

WHEREAS, by reason of population density, commercial, industrial, institutional or governmental use of land, or subdivision of land, said property is urban in character or suitable for urban purposes without unreasonable delay; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF COLD SPRING, KENTUCKY:

SECTION I

That the City of Cold Spring does hereby and herewith annex to its present boundaries and include the same within the territorial limits of the City of Cold Spring, Campbell County, Kentucky, the following described unincorporated land and area, located in the County of Campbell, Commonwealth of Kentucky, to-wit:

Parcel One: Group No. 7037/Z PIDN: 999-99-19-962.00

Beginning at a point in the easterly line of the right-of-way of Kentucky State Route No.27, in the dividing line between William Goetz and Albert

Schweitzer; thence N. 65 degrees 00' E. along the dividing line between said William Goetz and Albert Schweitzer 365.15 feet to a stake; thence N. 39 degrees 31' W., through the land of William Goetz, 178.8 feet to a stake; thence S. 64 degrees 38' W through the land of William Goetz, 378.65 feet to a stake in the easterly line of the right-of-way of Kentucky State Route No. 27; thence S. 43 degrees 46' E. along the easterly line of said right-of-way 180.28 feet to the place of beginning, containing 1.53 acres.

Excepting therefore 0.17 acre conveyed to Commonwealth of Kentucky by deed dated August 11, 2972, and recorded in Deed Book 141, Page 18, of the Campbell County Clerk's records at Alexandria, Kentucky.

Parcel Two: Group No. 70378/B2 PIDN: 999-99-19-961.00

Situated in the Cold Spring District of Campbell County, Commonwealth of Kentucky and being all of Lots Numbered 7, 8 and 9 of the William H. Goetz Subdivision as shown on a plat thereof recorded in Plat Book 5, Page 27 of the records of the Campbell County Clerk's office at Alexandria, Kentucky.

Excepted from the foregoing described property is all of that property conveyed by deed to the Commonwealth of Kentucky for the use and benefit of the Department of Highways dated August 5, 1972, and recorded in Deed Book 141, Page 20 of the Campbell County Clerk's records at Alexandria, Kentucky.

SECTION II

That this ordinance shall take effect and be in full force from and after its passage, publication and recording, according to law.
