CHAPTER 537.

1872.

AN ACT to repeal an act to amend the charter of the city of Paris, approved March 18, 1870.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

§ 1. That an act to amend the charter of the city of Paris, approved March 18, 1870, be, and the same is hereby, repealed, and that no lands, as provided in the original act of March 5th, 1868, entitled "An act to amend the charter of the city of Paris," within said extension, used merely for agricultural purposes, shall be subject to city taxation until the same shall be divided into, and used as town lots, of less than five acres.

§ 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.

CHAPTER 538.

\* AN ACT to change the name of Greenupsburg to Greenup.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

§ 1. That the name of the town of Greenupsburg, in Greenup county, be changed to that of Greenup, and by the name of the town of Greenup shall hereafter be known and called.

§ 2. That all acts, laws, and parts of laws, and all ordinances, bonds and obligations, contracts and agreements, existing and applicable and binding on the town of Greenupsburg, shall exist, be applicable and binding on the town of Greenup as if this act be not passed.

§ 3. This act shall take effect on the first day of April, 1872.

CHAPTER 539.

AN ACT to repeal chapter eight hundred and fifty-three of the acts approved at the session of 1869-'70.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

§ 1. That chapter eight hundred and fifty-three of the acts of 1869-'70, entitled "An act to amend the charter of the Richmond and Lexington Turnpike Road Company," be, and the same is hereby, repealed.

§ 2. This act shall take effect from its passage.

CHAPTER 541.

1872.

AN ACT to amend the charter of the town of Slaughtersville, Webster county.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

§ 1. That the marshal of said town shall have no power, authority, or jurisdiction, outside of the limits of said town.

§ 2. That all acts inconsistent with this are hereby repealed.

§ 3. This act shall take effect from its passage.

CHAPTER 542.

AN ACT to extend the boundary of the city of Owensboro.

*Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky:*

§ 1. That the boundaries of the city of Owensboro shall be as follows, viz: Beginning on the Ohio river where the street between Shelby and N. B. Allen comes to the river; thence south along the west line of said street in a straight line, to the road that leads to Monarch's distillery; thence down that road to the line between Morton's and A. Moreland's; thence south along said line to the Henderson road; thence up the north margin of said road to the junction of Walnut and McFarland streets; thence south along the east side of avenue or road leading out to Ray's, to the division line between Thos. Higgins and Jas. Weir; thence east along that line, and continuing in that direction, to the Hartford road; thence across the same, continuing the same course, one hundred and fifty yards; thence towards the Ohio river, parallel with the Hartford road, to the Litchfield road; thence east with the course of said road to the old Litchfield road; thence down the same, on the west margin, to the river.

§ 2. But it is fully understood and provided that none of the lots or territory so added to the present limits of the city of Owensboro shall be subject to, or liable to, the city railroad tax levied by the authorities of said city to pay its subscription to the Owensboro and Russellville Railroad, nor to pay the interest on bonds issued therefor, for three (3) years after the passage of this bill.

§ 3. This act to take effect from its passage.
