Dear Mr. Secretary:

The U.S. Census Bureau has developed the Count Question Resolution (CQR) program to resolve questions raised by municipalities concerning the Census 2000 counts involving housing unit counts and group quarters population counts.

The CQR program comprises the procedures and guidelines for receiving, processing, and responding to questions regarding officially released counts. This program will provide the Census Bureau with its first opportunity to address problems identified by local officials regarding the population count for their respective jurisdictions. Any processing errors identified by the Census Bureau will be reflected in the corrected population counts. We have enclosed a fact sheet that outlines important information on the CQR program.

The purpose of this letter is to inform you of CQR-revised housing unit and/or population counts from Census 2000 for jurisdictions within your state. Official statements to this effect have been sent to the highest elected official of the affected governmental units and are enclosed. As counts are revised for governments in your state, we will send copies to you on a periodic basis.

The Census Bureau will include these CQR corrections in the errata information to be made available via the Internet on the *American FactFinder* system at <a href="www.factfinder.census.gov">www.factfinder.census.gov</a>. The CQR corrections also will be used specifically to modify the decennial census file for use in yearly postcensal estimates, beginning in December 2002.

Census counts used for congressional apportionment and legislative redistricting and the Census 2000 data products will remain unchanged.
