Dear Mr. Brown and Mrs. Holsclaw:

Pursuant to KRS 83A.040 and KRS 118.305(7) you are hereby notified of vacancies that existed and were filled by the City of Indian Hills.

This is a unique situation in that the (new) City of Indian Hills was created by the merger or consolidation of the former cities of Indian Hills (Country Club), Indian Hills Cherokee, Robinswood, and Winding Falls. KRS provides that the elected legislative bodies of the merging cities continue in office until the next election. Here, by a series of resignations and appointments, the new city council was created and a Mayor appointed. The (new) City of Indian Hills is operating under the Mayor/Council form of government, as provided by the voters in the November, 1999, election.

Not all the resignations created vacancies requiring appointments because the City had to move from four Mayors and sixteen (16) commissioners to one Mayor and nine (9) City Councilmen.

The following resignations were received and accepted, although not necessarily in the order presented below, but

sequentially so that a quorum always existed:


