Letcher Circuit Court.

J.D.Campbell, R.R.Dicken, John L.Smith, W.A.Campbell, M.A.Dunlap, Tom H.Williams, Theo Walker, S.H.Kiser, Sam Hartt, Z.A.Walters, W.D.Sutton, Sandy Adams, H.B.Morgan, J.A.McKaskey, M.H.Duncan, James H.Wright, W.S.Perry, C.A.Cline, J.Lee Stoner, John D.W.Collins, Jake Moore, G.R.Wheaton, J.C.Gambill, Louis Wright, A.J.McKee, Joe Combs, Wm.Willis, and George Yates, having filed their petition in the office of the clerk of the Letcher Circuit Court, praying the territory or tract of land in said petition described, be incorporated into a town of the sixth class, and be given the name of Jenkins, and it appearing to the satisfaction of the court, that there are more than one hundred twenty five bona fide residents within the territory described therein, and that same does not exceed one-fourth of a mile in each direction necessary to form a square, that said petition is signed by more than two-thirds of the legal voters residing therein, and it further appearing that notice of the application and filing of said petition, signed by the foregoing persons named, was duly posted at the Courthouse door in Whitesburg, Kentucky, for more than ten days before the first day of the present term of court, and that same was published in the Mountain Eagle and the East Kentucky News, two weekly news papers published in Whitesburg, Kentucky, in two issues of each, just prior to the first day of the present term of this court, and that the petition aforesaid set out the bounds of the proposed town by metes and bounds, courses and distances, and the said notice set out the purposes for which the said petition was filed, and there being no remonstrance filed or defense made by any one.

It is therefore adjudged by the court, that the hereinafter

described tract of land be, and the same is now Incorporated as a town of the Sixth Class, and is named Jenkins, and is described as follows:

Situated in Letcher County, Kentucky, at the forks of the Elkhorn Creek, a tributary of the Russell Forks of the Big Sandy River, and more particularly described as follows;

BEGINNING at a stake on the South side of Elkhorn Creek and on the side of the Cumberland Mountain, (witnessed by a sugar tree bearing S 12 29 W 13 feet, and by a poplar bearing S 54 56 E 8 feet, , and also by a tack sunk in Babbitt in a large rock near the "Duncan" house, bearing S 88 20 E 730 feet, which point is known as base station "Forks A" of survey of the Consolidation Coal Company) thence N 66 30 W crossing Elkhorn Creek to a stake 40 feet west of the center of the spur between forks of Mill Hollow (witnessed by a chestnut bearing S 71 34 e 20 feet, and by a gum bearing N 20 18 W 11 feet) thence S 23 30 W again crossing Elkhorn Creek to a stake near the old barn near the "Jim Wright place" (witnessed by an apple tree bearing S 20 28 E 18 feet) thence S 66 30 E crossing Little Elkhorn Creek to a stake on the mountain side (witnessed by an ash tree, bearing N 57 21 E 17 feet and by a white oak bearing S 88 03 W 7 feet) thence N 23 30 E to the beginning, and being four lines, one-fourth of a mile in each direction necessary to form a square.

It is further adjudged by the court that W.D.Sutton, R.R.Dicken, M.H.Duncan, W.S.Perry and M.A.Dunlap be, and they are hereby appointed as Trustees of said town and that John D.W.Collins be and he is appointed as Police Judge of the said town, that H.B.Morgan be and he is hereby appointed as Marshall of the said town, and that James H. Wright is appointed as Assessor of said town. All of said officers will hold their respective offices until the next regular election at which officers may be elected.

It is further ordered that the appointment of John D.W.Collins as Police Judge of said town be certified to the Governor by the Clerk

of this court and that this judgment take effect presently and that the appointed officers enter on their respective duties as soon as they have qualified in conformity with law.

And this cause is now stricken from the docket.
