
Dear Ms. Clark:

ORDINANCE NO. 161

AN ORDINANCE ANNEXING UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY ADJOINING THE CITY OF LEBANON JUNCTION, KENTUCKY.

The City Council of the City of Lebanon Junction, Bullitt County, Kentucky, does hereby ordain as follows:

SECTION ONE: The City Council of the City of Lebanon Junction, Bullitt County, Kentucky, does hereby annex certain unincorporated territory to the City of Lebanon Junction, Bullitt County, Kentucky, and such territory shall become a part of the City for all purposes under the laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and such territory annexed is described as follows:

BEGINNING at the intersection of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company tracks and Airport Road, which is the current city limits, thence North 200 feet from the north right-of-way of Airport Road to a point; thence West parallel with Airport Road maintaining a 200 foot distance to the intersection of Airport Road and Kentucky Highway #434; thence with Kentucky Highway #434 staying 200 feet West and parallel to Kentucky Highway #434 to the North bank of the Rolling Fork River; thence continuing with the North bank of the Rolling Fork River low water mark to a point 400 feet East of the East right-of-way line of Interstate #65; thence parallel to and 400 feet East of the right-of-way line of Interstate #65 to a point 400 feet South of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company South right-of-way line; thence East parallel to and 400 feet South of the South right-of-way line of Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company right-of-way to a point 200 feet East of the East right-of-way line of Maraman Road; thence in a northerly direction parallel to and 200 feet East of the East right-of-way line of Maraman Road to a point 200 feet South of the South right-of-way line of Pine Tavern Road; thence in an easterly direction parallel with and 200 feet South of the South right-of-way of Pine Tavern Road to a point 200 feet East of the East right-of-way line of the short cut road between Pine Tavern Road and Camp Crescendo Road; thence in a northerly direction parallel with and 200 feet East of the short cut road to a point 600 feet South of its intersection with Camp Crescendo Road; thence in

a northerly direction parallel with and 600 feet East of the East right-of-way line of Camp Crescendo Road to the South Bank of Cane Run Creek; thence in a westerly direction to the East right-of-way line of Interstate #65; thence with the East right-of-way line of Interstate #65 to a point parallel to mile marker #107; thence in a westerly direction to the West right-of-way line of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company; thence in a southerly direction with the right-of-way line of the Louisville & Nashville Railroad Company to a point 200 feet North of the North right-of-way of Airport Road, being the point of beginning.

This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to KRS 81A.400 et. seq.


This Ordinance shall be published according to law.

RE: Implementation of House Bill 524 – Determining Risk Location

Dear Mayor Sweat,

In the 2008 Regular Session of the Kentucky General Assembly, House Bill (HB) 524 was passed in order to improve compliance in the collection and payment of local government insurance premium taxes. Part of this statute requires the Department of Insurance (Department) to determine the “location of risk” as it applies to taxable insurance policies.

In order to accurately determine the location of risk, the Department will need to use the following three things:

- Geographic Information System (GIS) software,
- Accurate address data, and
- A single source of accurate boundary maps showing up-to-date annexed areas

HB 524 requires that the Department use boundary data gathered by the Commonwealth Office of Technology (COT). COT gathers this boundary data from annexed maps that cities must file with the Secretary of State’s Office (SOS) per KRS 81A.470.

In working with staff from the SOS, COT and a GIS Software vendor, the Department has discovered that some cities may not have accurate, up-to-date annexation maps filed with the SOS. The Department was shown one example where only a small fraction of the actual cities maps had been filed.

House Bill 524
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For cities that have passed ordinances enacting taxes on insurance premiums, it is imperative that their annexation maps are filed and in compliance with KRS 81A.470 by no later than November 1, 2008. Failing to do so by this deadline could result in potential loss of tax revenue for your city.
