CHAP. 144 .- AN ACT to incorporate and extend the limits of the town of London, and to extend the limits of the town of Richmond.

Sec. 1. Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, That the boundary the town fix of the town of London, shall be as follows, to-wit: beginning at Garrard's south west corner; thence southwardly with the line of the widow Jackson's dower lands, to the Whitley branch; thence down the same to John II. Jackson's line; thence with said line northwardly, passing the east end of the town lots, to Garrard's line; thence with said line westwardly to the beginning, including the twenty-five acres of land, donated by John and James Jackson, for the public buildings of Laurel county, shall be, and the same is hereby established as the boundary of said town.

SEC. 2. Be it further enacted, That the town of London, shall be, and the same is hereby established as the permanent seat of justice for Laurel county, according to the original plan thereof, except Long tablished as street, which is hereby extended to sixty-six feet in county seat of width; and it shall be the duty of the proprietor, Laurel. and trustees of said town, to cause the streets and alleys to be extended, and a complete map or plan of proprietor of said town to be made out, numbering each lot, which land, and trusmap, when so made, shall be recorded in their record town. book, and also, in the clerk's office of the county of Laurel; and certified copies of the same, shall be good evidence in any controversy, touching the lots


