



HARLAN CIRCUIT COURT

IN THE MATTER OF:

PETITION FOR THE INCORPORATION OF
CITY OF LYNCH, HARLAN COUNTY, KENTUCKY

J U D G M E N T

This second day of the May 1963 regular term of the Harlan Circuit Court came the petitioners, by counsel, and filed herein the affidavit of R. Springer Hoskins, Editor of The Harlan Daily Enterprise, showing that notice of filing of the petition herein, and its object, has been published in the issues of April 18, 1963, and April 25, 1963, of said The Harlan Daily Enterprise, a daily newspaper of general circulation published in Harlan County, Kentucky, and the affidavit of Margaret G. Freeman, Publisher of Tri-City News, showing that notice of the filing of the petition herein, and its object, has been published in the issues of April 18, 1963, and April 25, 1963, of said Tri-City News, a weekly newspaper published at Cumberland, Harlan County, Kentucky,

And inasmuch as it appears that the petition herein is signed by more than two-thirds of the voters living within the boundary of the proposed municipality and that said petition was filed not less than twenty days before the commencement of the present term of this Court, and that more than 125 inhabitants reside within the boundaries of said municipality, and that said boundary of the proposed municipality does not extend more than one-half ($\frac{1}{2}$) mile in each direction and that

the form thereof is square, and that publication of notice of the filing of the petition and its object has been made by publication in two issues of a newspaper of general circulation in Harlan County as required by law and in two issues of another newspaper published weekly in Cumberland, Harlan County, Kentucky, and that no defense has been interposed herein;

And the Court having considered the pleadings, affidavit and oral evidence, and being further fully advised, now ORDERS AND ADJUDGES

That the following described territory be, and it is now hereby established as a city of the sixth class with all the powers and authority authorized by the Constitution and statutes of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, to be hereinafter known as City of Lynch:

BEGINNING at an iron pin on the southerly side of Kentucky State Highway Route No. 160, said point being South $83^{\circ} 31' 58''$ East, 7,683.94 feet from the zero point of United States Steel Corporation's Lynch Coordinate System, said zero point being on the boundary line of land of the International Harvester Company and said United States Steel Corporation; thence from said point of beginning the following four (4) courses and distances: (1) North $24^{\circ} 56'$ East, 909.00 feet to an iron pin; (2) North $65^{\circ} 04'$ West, 909.00 feet to an iron pin; (3) South $24^{\circ} 56'$ West, 909.00 feet to an iron pin; and (4) South $65^{\circ} 04'$ East, 909.00 feet to the iron pin at the place of beginning.

It is further ordered that E. Harold Gates, Arnold Prewitt, Sam J. Smith, Charles E. Sizemore and Verlin Dosssett, Jr., be and they are hereby appointed as Trustees of City of Lynch; that Alexander J. Feher be, and he is now hereby appointed as Police Judge; that Matthew Bowling be, and he is now hereby appointed as Marshall; and that Frank J. Vicini be, and he is now hereby appointed as Assessor of City of Lynch; and that each of said officers shall hold their

respective offices until the next regular election at which officers for cities of the sixth class may be elected, and until their successors shall have been elected and qualified.

It is further ordered that the Clerk of this Court be, and she is now hereby directed to certify within ten days after the date of this judgment, a copy of this judgment to the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky at Frankfort, Kentucky, in order that the same may be properly indexed and filed as a permanent record in his office.
