ING TO FINISH TO THE CLERK OF LYNDON, KEN TUCKY, IN THE COUNTY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY, THE PRESENT BOUNDARY LINE OF THE CITY OF LYNDON, KENTUCKY, MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED HEREINAFTER, THE COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF LYNDON, KEN TUCKY DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. Whereas it is deemed desirable and in the best interest of the city of Lyndon, and thus enlarge and extend the boundaries of said city to include same, of said tract of land which is now within the County of Jefferson, adjacent and contiguous to the present city boundary lines of the City of Lyndon, Kentucky, an accurate description of the boundary of the land proposed to be annexed being as follows: BEGINNING at a point in the northwesterly right-of-way line of Whips Mill Road which is the present Corporate limits of the City of Lyndon at its intersection with the southwesterly line of the property conveyed to Jefferson County by Deed of Record in Deed Book 431 Page 406 in the Office of the Jefferson County Court Clerk; thence along said northwesterly right-of-way line of Whips Mill Road in a northeasterly direction, with various courses, in all approximately 3,180' to the southerly line of the L & N Railroad; thence along said southerly line of L & N Railroad, in a westerly direction 550' more or less to a point at the Corporate limits of the City of Lyndon; thence northwesterly along said easterly line of Lyndon approximately 710' to the northerly line of LaGrange Road as presently established; thence along said northerly line of LaGrange Road in an easterly direction 4,680' more or less to the westerly line of Hounz Lane; thence along said line of Hounz Lane in a southerly direction 910' more or less to a point; thence continuing along the westerly line of Hounz Lane and its extensions 250' more or less to the southerly line of the aforesaid L & N Railroad in a westerly direction 1,010' more or less to the easterly line of Dorsey Lane; thence along said easterly line of Dorsey Lane in a southerly direction 3,600' more or less to a point, said point being the intersection of said easterly line of Dorsey Lane and the southerly line of the aforesaid tract to Jefferson County, if extended; thence along said tract to Jefferson County in a westerly direction 1,800' more or less to a point; thence continuing with said southerly line to Jefferson County 1,537' more or less to a point; and 1,510' more or less to a point in the easterly line of the property of University of Louisville by Deed of Record in Deed Book 413 Page 80 in aforesaid Clerk's Office, said line being also the aforesaid southwest-erly line of the tract to Jefferson County; thence along said last mentioned line common to University of Louisville and Jefferson County, in a northwesterly direction, 562' more or less to a point; thence continuing with said common line N82 degrees 15' W, 798.2' more or less; N74 degrees 58' E, 267' more or less and N61 degrees 53' W, 400' more or less to the aforesaid northwesterly right-of-way line of Whips Mill Road and the point of beginning.

SECTION 2. If you are a resident voter or owner of real property located within the limits of the territory proposed to be annexed and are opposed to being annexed you must file a petition with the Mayor of the City of Lyndon, Kentucky at 803, LaGrange Road, Lyndon, Kentucky 40222, stating your opposition. If more than fifty percent (50%) of the resident voters or owners of real property within the limits of the territory proposed to be annexed petition the Mayor in opposition to the proposal, an election shall be held at the next regular election occurring at least sixty (60) days after the petition is presented. If you wish to obtain a petition in opposition, you may do so at the Lyndon City Hall, 803, LaGrange Road, Lyndon, Kentucky 40222.

SECTION 3. If no objection is received within sixty (60) days of the date of this publication, the City of Lyndon will proceed to annex the property described above, said territory becoming part of the City. The final date for objection is October 26, 1984.

SECTION 4. Immediately upon the effective date hereof, the Clerk of the City of Lyndon is hereby authorized and directed to publish this Ordinance in two (2) issues of the Louisville Times in the absence of a daily or weekly newspaper published within the boundaries of the City.

SECTION 5. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and approval.
