



AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE,
ANNEXING TO THE CITY LIMITS OF THE CITY OF
MADISONVILLE, KENTUCKY A CERTAIN TRACT OF LAND
ADJACENT TO AND CONTIGUOUS TO THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF MADISONVILLE, KENTUCKY:

WHEREAS, the City of Madisonville has deemed it desirable and has proposed to annex to the City of Madisonville, Kentucky, and extend the boundaries of the City of Madisonville, Kentucky, to include a certain tract of land which is adjacent to and contiguous with the present City boundary and which by population density is urban in character and suitable for urban purposes without unreasonable delay and;

WHEREAS, on the 4th day of March, 1985, an Ordinance proposing to annex the hereinafter described tract of land was given first reading by the Madisonville City Council and on the 18th day of March, 1985, the Ordinance proposing to annex said tract of land was given a second reading and adopted by the Madisonville City Council and was published pursuant to law, and there was no petition in opposition filed with the Mayor of the City of Madisonville from the resident voters or owners of real property within the limits of the territory proposed to be annexed. More than sixty (60) days have elapsed since the adoption and enactment of the original Ordinance seeking to annex said territory;

Section I. Therefore, the City of Madisonville hereby annexes by Ordinance to the City territory and extends its boundaries to include a certain tract of land hereinafter described and upon passage of this Ordinance the territory shall become a part of the City of Madisonville, Kentucky, for all purposes henceforth.

Section II. A particular description of the tract of land annexed is as follows:

A certain tract of land or parcel of land lying on the waters of Elk Creek in the County and State aforesaid, bounded and described as follows:

Beginning at a iron pin in the original line northeast intersection of the railroad and Kentucky Highway 254; thence approximately North along the east right-of-way of said Highway 330 feet to an iron pin; thence approximately east and parallel with said railroad 295 feet to an iron pin; thence in a southerly direction 330 feet parallel with said Highway to an iron pin in the north right-of-way of said railroad; thence in a westerly direction 295 feet along the north right-of-way of said railroad to an iron pin point of beginning.

Being the same property conveyed to James G. Haywood and his wife, Krista A. Haywood, by deed from Homer Suthard, Jr., said deed being dated the 3rd day of March, 1983, and of record in Deed Book 432 at page 217, office of the Hopkins County Court Clerk.

Section III. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to immediately publish this Ordinance pursuant to KRS Chapter 424 and this Ordinance shall be effective from and after its passage, signing and upon publication as required by law.

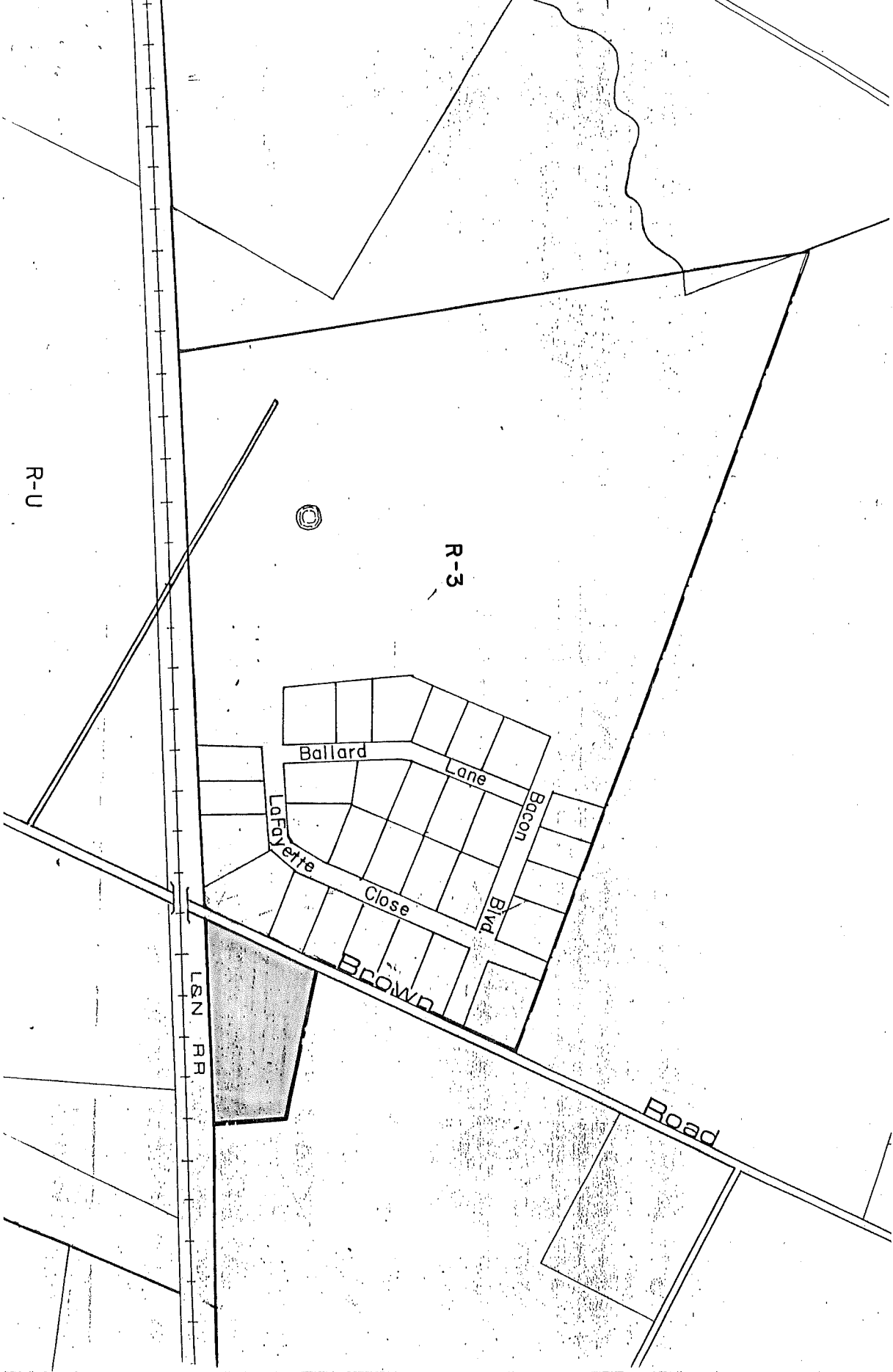
