ORDINANCE NO. 95- 13

AN ORDINANCE CONFIRMING ANNEXATION OF UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY ADJOINING THE CITY OF MT. WASHINGTON, BULLITT COUNTY, KENTUCKY.


BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Mt. Washington, Bullitt County, as follows:

SECTION I: The City Council of the City of Mt. Washington, Bullitt County, Kentucky, does hereby ordain that it confirms the annexation of certain unincorporated territory to the City of Mt. Washington, Bullitt County, Kentucky, as such territory shall become a part of the Commonwealth of Kentucky; and further, such territory annexed is described as follows:


Being a 58.349 acre tract of Goodlett, as shown by survey of Advaced Land Surveys, dated March 23, 1995.

SECTION II: The City Clerk is hereby directed to publish this Ordinance in accordance with the Kentucky Revised Statutes.

DESCRIPTION

First Tract: Beginning at a stone at a line division corner to W. R. Newkirk; thence with the middle of a fence South $19\frac{1}{4}$ West $159\frac{1}{2}$ poles to a stone southwardly from a spring; thence South $51\frac{1}{4}$ East 10 poles to a stake South 6 East $54\frac{3}{5}$ poles to a stake, a corner to W. R. Newkirk in a line of Rebecca F. Hall's lot and with the same South 83 East 201 poles to a stake in Jas. King's line which is the original line of Nicholas Lewis' 1000 acres and with the same North 15 for 13 East $95\frac{1}{2}$ poles to an Ash, White Walnut and Red Bud passing a Honey Locust at Dry Run at $55\frac{1}{2}$ poles; thence North $71\frac{3}{4}$ West $89\frac{1}{2}$ poles to two Black Oaks and fallen Dogwood; thence North $8\frac{1}{2}$ East 71 poles to two Red Oak and Sugar Tree Stump; thence North 65 for 71 West 24 poles crossing McCulloch's Run to a Hickory stump, corner to four acres by Jno. Cornell's heirs and the old Dickey Tract: thence North $67\frac{1}{2}$ West 99 poles to the beginning, containing 211 acres of land, more or less, a passway twenty feet wide is left on the line "A" "B" as shown on surveyors plat.

Second Tract: Lying and being in Bullitt County, Kentucky, and adjoining the said above described tract and bounded as follows:
On the west by the lands of John W. King on the North by the lands of Willard A. Hall, on the East by the Owan's farm and on the South by the lands of John W. King, containing four acres, of ground.

This was conveyed Paul S. Hackert and Richard L. Ruka by a deed from Charles Wheeler, etc. dated November 8, 1955, recorded in Deed Book 86 Page 610 in office of clerk of Bullitt County Court.
