ORDINANCE NO. 115

ORDINANCE ANNEXING TERRITORY INTO THE TOWN OF PARK CITY, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the Town Board of Trustees of the Town of Park City, Barren County, Kentucky, has by Ordinance No. 110 adopted on October 7, 1974, stated its intention to annex the unincorporated territory hereinafter described into the City of Park City; and

WHEREAS, said Ordinance No. 110 was duly published in the Glasgow Daily Times in accordance with Chapter 424 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes on the 10th day and again on the 28th day of October, 1974; and

WHEREAS, more than 30 days has elapsed since the first enactment of said Ordinance following by publication of its adoption and no petition has been filed in the Barren Circuit Court protesting said annexation;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that the Town Board of Trustees of Park City, Kentucky does hereby annex into the city limits of Park City, Kentucky, the following described previously unincorporated territory:

A certain parcel of land located in Park City, Ky., and being more clearly described as follows:

Beginning at concrete monument on Tunnel Hill on the North East side of Park City, said monument being a corner in the existing city limits of said City, also the center line of the L & N Railroad; thence with the center line of said Railroad N 72 deg. 52' B 1595.07 feet to a P.K. nail in the center of said Railroad, said nail being opposite a woven wire fence; thence with said fence S 12 deg. 35' B 1645.52 feet to an iron pin in the North edge of U. S. 31-W; thence

continuing on with the same line crossing U. S. 31-W, S 12 deg. 35' E 1168.02 feet to a concrete monument; thence S 72 deg. 21' W 2807.10 feet to a post in an existing fence line; thence continuing with said line S 72 deg. 21' W 245.48 feet to a point in the existing City Limits of Park City: thence with the existing city limits N 17 deg. 39 W 2106.29 feet to a point in the existing city limits; thence S 85 deg. 31' E 265.00 feet; thence with the same line S 85 deg. 31' E 761.00 feet to a point, said point being in the East line of a Cemetery; thence with the Cemetery and existing city limits N 17 deg. 53' W 1103.49 feet to a point in the center line of the L & N Railroad; thence with the center of said Railroad N 70 deg. 50' B 760.00 feet to a concrete monument, being the point of beginning and containing 185 acres more or less as perssurvey of July 19, 1974.
