Affidavit

We affirm that to the best of our knowledge that the population of the City of Pembroke meets or exceeds the criteria for a city of the 5th class.

The population of the City of Pembroke is made up of the below listed demographics.

1. Homes consisting of 425.
2. Three apartment complexes with 61 rental units.
3. Business Occupancies of 15.
4. Nursing and Rehabilitation complex with a 60-bed capacity and 80 staff.
5. Elementary School with 390 students and 58 staff.
6. Childcare facility with 50 children and 12 staff.

The above demographics estimated an approximate city population of between 1100 – 1400 daily. This figure was obtained as a good faith estimate of the daily population in the City of Pembroke, based on our experience, knowledge and belief. We believe the 2010 census conflicts with this figure due to the lack of knowledge of our corporate boundaries and the increase of apartment rentals in part due to our close proximity to Fort Campbell and the return of deployed military personnel and their families to our city.

RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PEMBROKE, KENTUCKY STATING THAT BASED ON THE AREA AND ECONOMIC CONDITIONS OF THE CITY, THE CITY OF PEMBROKE, BY AND THROUGH ITS MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION SEEKS TO BE RECLASSIFIED AS A CITY OF THE FIFTH CLASS.

WHEREAS, the City of Pembroke has increased its boundaries to (1.2) square miles in area;

WHEREAS, the City of Pembroke is located approximately one mile from the site of the Commerce Park, and is therefore presented with unprecedented opportunities for economic development, and population and job growth;


WHEREAS, the present classification of Pembroke as a city of the sixth class does not provide a suitable framework for continued growth and development of the City,

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the forgoing premises, the City of Pembroke hereby resolves as follows:

SECTION 1. In consideration of the present economic opportunities available to the City of Pembroke and based on the area there in, the City of Pembroke seeks to be reclassified as a City of the Fifth Class, and does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor, City Clerk and City Attorney to take sure steps as may be necessary to effect such reclassification.

SECTION 2. The foregoing RESOLUTION was read, passed and adopted by the City Commission of Pembroke, Christian County, Kentucky in a duly advertised public meeting held on the 21st day of January 2013 was thereafter approved by the Mayor.
