

**RESOLUTION OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, KENTUCKY STATING THAT
BASED ON THE POPULATION OF THE CITY, THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE, BY
AND THROUGH ITS COMMISSION AND THE MAYOR, SEEKS TO BE
RECLASSIFIED AS A CITY OF THE FOURTH CLASS**

WHEREAS, as established by Section 156 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky (now repealed) the City of Pikeville by population is should be ranked a 4th class city; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pikeville through special legislation in the 1980's was reclassified as a 3rd class city by the Kentucky General Assembly; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pikeville understands the importance of the classification system set forth by the Constitution of the Commonwealth and therefore does wish to maintain its integrity by being reclassified back to a 4th class city in order to meet the population requirement as the constitution describes ; and

WHEREAS, the City of Pikeville current population as documented by the 2000 Census is listed at 6,295. Under the requirements set forth by the Constitution of the Commonwealth under section 156 states city's with a population between a population of 3,000 and 7,999 shall be classified as a 4th class city. Pikeville's classification should therefore be set as a city of the 4th class; and

WHEREAS, the Pikeville City Commission by the adoption of this resolution does meet all requirements set forth by KRS81.032 respectfully submitting to the Kentucky General Assembly a request for the City of Pikeville to be reclassified based upon the cities current population as documented by the 2000 Census as required by KRS81.032 (3);

NOW THEREFORE, in consideration of the foregoing premises, the City of Pikeville hereby resolves as follows:

SECTION 1. In consideration of the present population of the City of Pikeville based upon the 2000 Census, the City of Pikeville seeks to be reclassified as a

Fourth Class City as it should be set forth by the Constitution of the Commonwealth and does hereby authorize and direct the Mayor, the City Clerk, the City Manager and the City Attorney to take whatever steps are necessary to have the City reclassified.

SECTION 2. That the city has met all requirements set forth by KRS 81.032 and therefore by the passage of this resolution does ask the General Assembly to act through new legislation during the 2011 Legislative Session of reclassifying the City of Pikeville to a city of the 4th class.

SECTION 3. The foregoing RESOLUTION was read, passed and adopted by the City Commission of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky, meeting in regular session on the 13th day of December, 2010.

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81.026 Effect of reclassification of city on existing ordinances and officers

(1) When a city has been assigned by the General Assembly to another class, it shall thereafter be governed by the laws relating to the class to which it has been assigned, but the transfer from one class to another shall not affect any ordinance theretofore enacted by the city, except that any ordinance in conflict with the laws relating to cities of the class to which the city has been assigned shall be repealed to the extent it so conflicts.

(2) Any officer holding office in any city changed to a classification other than that held at the time the officer was elected shall hold his office until the term for which he was elected has expired.

81.032 Requirements for reclassification of an incorporated area

(1) Prior to the reclassification of any incorporated area by the General Assembly, the legislative body of such area shall provide to the General Assembly by certified resolution the population data as required by subsections (2) and (3) of this section.

(2) Prior to the reclassification of any incorporated area by the General Assembly, such area shall have attained the population requirements as established by Section 156 of the Constitution of the Commonwealth of Kentucky.

(3) The population of any city proposed for reclassification shall be based on consideration of the most recent municipal population estimates as provided by the United States Bureau of Census, except that if recent growth in a city makes such estimates invalid, a city may submit for consideration an affidavit to certify such new growth. Such an affidavit shall be supported by documentation which may include more recent property valuation information, door to door population counts or other municipal data, such as annexation records, which may not be included in the recent population estimates.

81.034 Recording of data by General Assembly

Prior to the reclassification of any incorporated area by the General Assembly, the estimated population data and the constitutional reclassification information as required by KRS 81.032 shall be recorded with the summary of any such legislative proposal in the official record of the General Assembly.

81.036 Recording of reclassification with Secretary of State

Upon reclassification of an incorporated area, the General Assembly shall provide the Secretary of State notice of the reclassification and a copy of the certified information which was presented to the General Assembly. Such information shall be maintained by the Secretary of State along with other information relating to such area as required by KRS 81.045.


**STATEMENT OF MAYOR AND CLERK

COME NOW Frank Justice, Mayor and Melanie Stevens, City Clerk, City of Pikeville, who make the following Statement regarding their good faith estimate of the population of the city, based upon their experience, knowledge and belief.

1. The 2000 Census Report for the City of Pikeville, Pike County, Kentucky showed a population at that time of 6,295.
2. The 2000 Census Report is believed to represent the true City of Pikeville population during this time.
3. The classification of a 4th class city should be between 3,000 and 7,999 and the City of Pikeville's population set by the 2000 Census meets these guidelines.
4. It is believed since the 2000 Census report was taken of the City of Pikeville has not annexed territory with population that would increase the City's population above the 7,999 population.
5. It is believed that the City of Pikeville's current population is well below the 7,999 population requirement to be a city of the 4th class.
