ORDINANCE

TO ANNEX TO THE CITY OF PINEVILLE, KENTUCKY,
TERRITORY ON THE WEST SIDE OF THE CITY

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PINEVILLE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

1. It is deemed desirable and for the interest and benefit of the City of Pineville, Kentucky, and the residents and owners of property in the territory hereinafter described, that such territory be annexed to and become a part of the City of Pineville, Kentucky.
2. It is hereby ordained and declared that the City of Pineville, Kentucky, pursuant to the provisions of Kentucky Revised Statutes, section 81.210 et seq., proposes to annex, as a part of this municipality, that territory situated immediately adjacent to the present western boundary of the City of Pineville, in Bell County, Kentucky, and more particularly bounded and described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a cross cut on a stone near an iron rod driven in the ground on the south bank of Mile Branch about 340 feet from the center of U. S. Highway 25E near the mouth of Mile Branch; thence crossing said branch N 49-45 W 217.15 feet to a concrete monument standing at the south side of a 25 foot driveway; thence running with the south side of said driveway S 47 W 37.3 feet to a stake; thence S 84-22 W 150.9 feet to a stake in a drain; thence N 80-45 W 189.34 feet to a concrete monument about 12 inches high 19.6 feet to the left of said drain, a corner of Lot 16, and bearing S 7-10 E from said corner; thence running with the line of Lot 17, S 7-10 E 352.4 feet to an iron pipe at the roots of a 30 inch Black Oak standing on the side of the ridge; thence running down the ridge toward Mile Branch S 28-30 E 338 feet to a concrete monument standing near the south side of the present road leading up Mile Branch and in the old bed of said Branch, said monument is marked Ellen Wilson Lot 18 on one side and Lot 17 on the other side; thence running with the old bed of said branch crossing said road N 14-39 E 44.7 feet to a stake at the edge of a driveway leading to the Jene Felton residence; thence continuing with the old bed of said branch N 52-33 E 72.78 feet to a stake in said branch; thence continuing with the bed of said old branch N 64-24 E 60.8 feet to a stake in the present flow of said Mile Branch at the termination of the old bed of said branch; thence running down the present bed of Mile Branch where it now flows, N 67-24 E 114.76 feet to a stake in said branch; thence N 41-28 E 197.96 feet to a stake in said branch; thence N 9-11 W 67.3 feet to the point of beginning, and containing three acres more or less.

3. This ordinance shall be published in the Pineville Sun a weekly newspaper published in the City of Pineville, Kentucky, for three consecutive weeks, beginning with the issue of March 11, 1965, and ending with the issue to be published March 25, 1965.

4. The City Attorney is hereby directed to prepare and file in the Circuit Court of Bell County, Kentucky, a complaint in the name and on behalf of the City of Pineville seeking and demanding the annexation of the territory hereinabove described to be a part of the City of Pineville, Kentucky, in the form and manner required by law, and to prosecute same to judgment in said court. Notice of the filing of said petition shall be published and given in the same manner as notice of passage of this ordinance.

AN ORDINANCE
CREATING AND ESTABLISHING AN AGENCY
TO TAKE CHARGE OF AND OPERATE THE
SEWAGE TREATMENT AND DISPOSAL SYSTEM
OF THE CITY OF PINEVILLE, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, by use of funds granted to the City of Pineville, Kentucky, by the Federal Government and additional funds obtained by the said City from the sale of Sewer Revenue Bonds authorized by ordinance adopted by the City Council on July 6, 1964, the said City is now in process of constructing a sewage treatment plant and other improvements to its sanitary sewers in order to provide a sewage treatment and disposal system to serve the residences, business establishments, and other establishments and institutions within the City;

WHEREAS it is expected that said construction of the sewage treatment and disposal system will be completed and ready to be placed in use and operation on or about June 1, 1965; and

WHEREAS it is the desire and intent of the Mayor and City Council that said sewage treatment and disposal system be operated, managed and maintained in a competent, efficient, economical, and business-like manner, free and clear of political considerations and influences;

BE IT ORDAINED by the City Council of the City of Pineville, Kentucky:

1. An agency of the City of Pineville, Kentucky, hereby named the PINEVILLE MUNICIPAL SANITATION COMMISSION, is hereby created and established for the purpose of taking charge of, operating and maintaining the entire sanitary sewage treatment and disposal system, including all sanitary sewers, pumping stations, machinery and other facilities appurtenant thereto.

2. The said Commission shall consist of five (5) persons appointed by the Mayor subject to the approval of the City Council. Each member of the Commission shall be not less than twenty-five (25) years of age and a legal resident, voter and citizen of the City of Pineville, Kentucky, for not less than one (1) year next before his or her election. Not more than three (3) members of the Commission shall be members of any one political party at the same time. Any member who, after his or her election, shall change his or her political party affiliation and registration so as to become the fourth member of the Commission to be affiliated with the same political party shall thereby vacate his or her office as a member of the Commission, and another shall be appointed to fill such vacancy. To further insure that the Commission shall be non-partisan and non-political, no person shall be appointed a member thereof who has within the last year before appointment held any city or county elective office, or who is related within the third degree to the Mayor or any

WHEREAS, by Ordinance adopted March 8, 1965 and appearing in Council Order Book No. 14, pages ~~26-27~~⁶²⁶⁻⁶²⁷, the City of Pineville, Kentucky, declared its intent to annex, as a part of the City, three acres, more or less, of territory adjoining its present boundary, and directing due publication thereof, and directing its City Attorney to institute proper proceeding in the Bell Circuit Court seeking judgment for the annexation of said territory, and whereas said ordinance was duly published in The Pineville Sun, a newspaper published and having a circulation in Pineville, Kentucky, in three weekly issues thereof commencing with its issue of March 11, 1965;
