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In-Depth View of Southeast Asia

Aug. 21 on KET

Globe Watch is a series that examines the history, current events, and problems of areas of the world. On Saturday, Aug. 21, it focuses on "Southeast Asia: Region on the Rise" as KET presents seven back-to-back programs beginning at 12:30 p.m. They cover three members of the Association of Southeast Asian Nations: Malaysia, Singapore, and Indonesia.

Southeast Asia is one of the most dynamic regions in the world. Former dictatorships are moving toward democracy, economies are growing at lightning pace, and multi-ethnic societies are at peace. Indeed, it has been predicted that the 21st could be the "Pacific Century."

The first program traces the region's development from colonial rule through the years since independence and explores some of the keys to its growth. The next two programs examine Malaysia, home to one of the most ethnically complex societies in the world, where the move from an economy based on natural resources to one of high-tech exports has led to considerable progress.

The tiny island of Singapore is the subject of two programs covering the history of the former British colony. Under the leadership of Lee Kuan Yew, the nation has found peace and prosperity, but certain freedoms have been curbed.

Finally the contrasts existing in Indonesia, a chain of islands, are examined. The capital, Jakarta, is a metropolis of international corporations, but a traditional

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING TERRITORY TO THE CITY OF RADCLIFF, KENTUCKY

LOCATED ADJACENT TO THE MILL CREEK BAPTIST CHURCH PROPERTY

WHEREAS, the city council of the city of Radcliff, pursuant to KRS 81A.420, on May 27, 1993, adopted an ordinance stating the intention of the city of Radcliff to annex territory which is described below, and

WHEREAS, said territory was accurately described in said ordinance and further complies with all the requirements of KRS 81A.420, and

WHEREAS, all of the property owners and/or registered voters in the territory to be annexed have signed waivers, valuing their right to participate against said annexation, and the ordinance stating the intention of the city of Radcliff to annex said territory having been published;

IT IS, THEREFORE, be it ordained by the city council of the city of Radcliff, as follows:

The following property is hereby annexed, and the same is hereby incorporated within the municipal boundaries and limits to the city of Radcliff, Kentucky, and said territory is described as follows:

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTER NINE HEALTH CLUBS, MASSAGE SALONS, ETC., FOR THE CITY OF RADCLIFF, KENTUCKY

WHEREAS, the City Council of Radcliff, Kentucky adopted an Ordinance establishing the Code of Ordinance of the City of Radcliff, Kentucky on the 21st day of February, 1978; and

WHEREAS, Kentucky Revised Statutes Chapter 82 authorizes and empowers the city to impose civil fines, penalties and forfeitures for violations of its ordinances payable directly to the city, and obtain injunctions and abatement orders to insure compliance with ordinance requirements when appropriate; and

WHEREAS, the City Council is desirous of amending said Ordinance, entitled "Health Clubs, Massage Salons, etc.," Chapter 9; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED that Chapter 9 of the Code of Ordinances for the City of Radcliff is hereby amended by adding

RESIDING at the Northeast corner of the church lot in Charlie Burnett's line; thence Eastwardly with Burnett's line 250 feet; thence Southwardly and parallel with the East line of Church lot 412 feet; thence Westwardly 210 feet to the East line of the church lot; thence with said line Northwardly 250 feet to the beginning.

Said property is owned by Shirley Atcher, Earl Shelton, Chester Louis Hall and Bryan Atcher, trustees of the Mill Creek Baptist church.

Read at a meeting of the Radcliff City Council on the 20th day of July, 1993; a second reading was held on the 9th day of August, 1993; and said ordinance was passed and approved at a meeting of the Radcliff City Council on the 9th day of August, 1993.

Months imprisonment for each offense, and a separate offense shall be deemed committed on each day during of which a violation occurs or continues. Any person violating this ordinance may also be found guilty of a civil offense. The civil fine shall be not less than twenty dollars (\$20.00) nor more than two hundred fifty dollars (\$250.00). The civil fine shall be paid directly to the City of Radcliff. If the fine is not paid within thirty (30) days from the date of notification, then the city may recover said fine in civil action in a court of proper jurisdiction. The city may also obtain injunctions or abatement orders to insure compliance with this ordinance or pursue administrative remedies when appropriate, including injunctions and abatement proceedings.

The remainder of Chapter 9 shall remain the same.

Read at a meeting of the Radcliff City Council on the 20th day of July, 1993; a second reading was held on the 9th day of August, 1993; and said Ordinance was read, passed and approved on the 9th day of August, 1993.
