J U D G E M E N T

The petitioners in the above styled matter having moved for judgment by and through their counsel, and the Court being sufficiently advised, and the record being complete therein,

THE COURT NOW FINDS that proper notice of the filing of the petition herein and of its object has been given by publication pursuant to KRS Chapter 424, that no defense or other responsive pleading has been interposed herein and that the time for same has elapsed, and that the population within the prescribed boundary of the city is sufficient, being more than the number of 125 inhabitants residing therein as required by statute.

NOW THEREFORE IT IS ADJUDGED, ORDERED AND DECREED:

1. That a city of the sixth class, to be known as and named the City of Ryland Heights, Kentucky, is hereby established in accordance with the prayer of the petition, and that the same is now incorporated, and that its boundary is described by metes and bounds, as follows:

Lying and being in the County of Kenton and Commonwealth of Kentucky and described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at a point on the west right of way line

feet more or less south of the center line of White Road extended, and said point being the northeast corner of the James Moss property; thence, North 70 degrees 30 minutes West 2640 feet to a point; thence, South 40 degrees West 2360 feet to a point on a ridge; thence, South 50 degrees East 2540 feet to a point on the west right of way line of Decoursey Pike as it existed on November 7, 1963; thence, northeasterly along the west right of way line as it meanders 2930 feet more or less to the point on the said west right of way line where it intersects the center line of Arrowhead Road extended, thence continuing northeasterly along the west right of way line 600 feet more or less to the point of beginning.

2. That the following persons are hereby appointed as officers of the aforesaid city, as follows: Chester G. Beckham, Roy G. Culbertson, Edwin Miller, John A. Leistner and Wanda H. Sebastian, who shall serve in the capacity of Trustees, Lawrence Halfhill in the capacity of Police Judge, Joseph A. Sebastian in the capacity of Marshal, Elleworth Gebhardt in the capacity of City Assessor, Roy Pierce in the capacity of City Clerk and Don Duncan in the capacity of City Treasurer; all to hold their respective offices until the next general election at which officers for cities and towns may be elected.

3. That the said City of Aylend Heights, by virtue of its establishment and incorporation, is invested with all the powers, duties and authority as are provided for cities and towns.
