J U D G M E N T

This cause on joint motion of the parties having been submitted to the Court for judgment on the pleadings and exhibits, and the Court being advised,

IT IS CONSIDERED, ORDERED AND ADJUDGED that the following described territory be and is hereby established as a City of the Sixth Class with all the powers and authorities authorized by the constitution and by-laws of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and to be known as the City of Silver Grove;

Lying and being in Campbell County, Kentucky and within the Silver Grove graded common school district of said County, beginning in the center of Linden Road, 103.11 feet,  $S23^{\circ}-00'W$ , from the intersection of the center line of said Linden Road with the southerly line of Fourth street; said point of beginning being also the intersection of the center line of Linden Road with the southerly line of the Silver Grove Subdivision; thence  $N78^{\circ}-38'-56" W$  for a distance of 2640 feet; thence  $N11^{\circ}-21'04"E$  for a distance of 2640 feet; thence  $S78^{\circ}-38'-56"E$  for a distance of 2640 feet; thence  $S11^{\circ}-21'04"W$  for a distance of 2640 feet, to the place of beginning.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED THAT Robert Janson, Charles Jones, Gerald Losey, Chester Rankin and Mrs. Oscar Ruschel be

and they are hereby appointed as trustees of said City of Silver Grove to hold their respective offices until the next election at which officers for cities may be elected and until their successors are qualified; and that James Staton be and he is hereby appointed police judge of said city to hold that office until the next election at which officers for cities may be elected and until his successor qualifies; and that Louis H. Jacobs, Jr. be and he is hereby appointed marshal of said city to hold that office until the next election at which officers for cities may be elected and until his successor qualifies; and that Charley A. Menley be and he is hereby appointed assessor for said city to hold that office until the next election at which officers for cities may be elected and until his successor qualifies.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the Clerk of this Court be and he is hereby ordered to certify forthwith a copy of this Order to the Secretary of State at Frankfort, Kentucky, who shall properly index and file the same as a permanent record in his office. To all of the foregoing, the intervening petitioner, remonstrant and defendant, the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company, objects and excepts and prays an appeal to the Court of Appeals which is granted.
