

JUDGMENT INCORPORATING THE CITY OF
SOUTH SHORE AND APPOINTING OFFICERS.

On this July 2, 1957, being the second day of the July, 1957 term of the Greenup Circuit Court, the matter of incorporating the City of South Shore, and appointing officers therefor, came on to be heard upon the petition herein regularly filed in the office of the Clerk of the Greenup Circuit Court on the 10th day of June, 1957, upon the notice of the filing of the petition to incorporate the City of South Shore and to appoint officers therefor, duly published for two issues of the Greenup News, a newspaper published in and of general circulation in Greenup County, Kentucky, in its June 14, 1957 and June 21, 1957 issues, together with the affidavit of publication and which notice was also posted at three public places within the territory sought to be incorporated, together with affidavit of such posting, and upon affidavit of Henry R. Alexander,

and _____ in support of said petition, and upon the testimony of witnesses and statement of counsel in support of said petition. Upon consideration of all of which, the Court finds, orders and adjudges as follows:

Findings of Fact

1. The territory sought to be incorporated and named South Shore is located in Greenup County, Kentucky and is described as follows:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the southerly line of the southerly line of 2nd Avenue with the westerly line of Bullerton Ave., thence N 64°-47' E 2640 feet to a point; thence S 35°-13' E, 2640 feet to a point; thence S 54°-47' W 2640 feet to a point; thence N 35°-13' W, 2640 feet to the point of beginning, as shown on map thereof attached thereto and made a part thereof, the same being one-half mile in each direction and being in the form of a square.

Said territory lies along both sides of the highway known as U. S. #33, is located approximately 2 miles from the Kentucky end of U. S. Grant Bridge and approximately

0.5 miles from the northwestern end of the bridge on U. S. #23 crossing Tygart Creek and the northerly boundary is approximately 0.1 mile from the Ohio River, and said territory is located approximately 16.5 miles from Greenup, Kentucky.

Said territory is one-half mile on each side and is in the form of a square.

2. The total number of residents residing within said territory by actual count made on June 4, 5 and 6, 1957 is 524, and the number of legal registered voters residing within said territory is 250, and the number of legal registered voters signing the petition to incorporate said territory and name it South Shore is 176, being 70.4 percent of all the legal voters residing in said territory.

3. The petition seeking the incorporation of said territory as a city and seeking the naming of the City South Shore and seeking the appointment of officers for the same was signed by Henry R. Alexander, Chandas Calhou Paul W. McCallister and 173 other persons making 176 all together and the signatures appearing on said petition are the genuine autographic signatures of the said 176 persons whose names appear on said petition and each of said 176 persons is a legal registered voter residing within said territory.

4. Said petition was filed in the office of the Clerk of the Greenup Circuit Court on the 10th day of June, 1957 and notice of the filing of same was given by publication of notice of filing of petition to incorporate said territory as the City of South Shore and to appoint officers therefor, in the Greenup News, a newspaper published in and of general circulation in Greenup County Kentucky, for two issues, to-wit: the June 14, 1957 and June 21, 1957 issues of said newspaper, prior to this date as required by KRS 91.050 and notice was also given by posting notices of the filing of said petition at three public places within said territory for more than ten days prior to the date of this hearing. Said notices as published and as posted gave notice of the time and place of the hearing upon said petition in the Greenup Circuit Court.

It is, therefore, ordered and adjudged:

1. The territory mentioned and described in the petition is located in Greenup, Kentucky and is described as follows:

Beginning at the point of intersection of the southerly line of the southerly line of 2nd Avenue with the easterly line of Fullerton Ave., thence N $54^{\circ}-47'$ E 2640 feet to a point; thence S $35^{\circ}-13'$ E 2640 feet to a point; thence S $54^{\circ}-47'$ W 2640 feet to a point; thence N $35^{\circ}-13'$ W 2640 feet to the point of beginning, as shown on map thereof attached thereto and made a part thereof, the same being one-half mile in each direction and being in the form of a square.

Said territory lies along both sides of the highway known as U. S. #23 is located approximately 2 miles from the Kentucky end of U. S. Grant Bridge and approximately 0.5 miles from the northwesterly end of the Bridge on U. S. #23 crossing Tygart Creek and the northerly boundary is approximately 0.1 mile from the Ohio River, and said territory is located approximately 16.5 miles from Greenup, Kentucky.

Said territory is one-half mile on each side and it is in the form of a square,

and the same is hereby incorporated as a city and is named South Shore and until the General Assembly shall assign it to some other class, shall be a city of the sixth class, having and exercising all the rights, privileges and powers of a city of the sixth class as provided by KRS 81.060 and KRS 81.070

2. The following persons are named officers to fill the following respective offices and shall hold their said offices until their successors shall be elected or appointed according to law, to-wit:

Said officers upon their taking the oath of office and qualifying as provided by law shall have all the powers of such officers of cities of the sixth class.

3. The Clerk of this court will, within ten days after entry of this judgment, furnish a certified copy of same to the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky, who shall index and file same as a permanent record in his office.
