Judgment

The petition and application herein having been sub-
 mitted to the Court for judgment and it appearing
 that said petition was filed more than twenty days
 before the commencement of the present regular term
 of the Court and that the petitioners have before the
 commencement of this term caused notice of the filing
 and object thereof to be published in two issues of the
 Prestonsburg Post a newspaper of general circulation
 published in Floyd County Kentucky and it appearing that
 the petition is in due form and no defense having been
 interposed it is ordered that the prayer of the petition
 be and the same is hereby granted

It is therefore adjudged by the Court that said
 town of Wayland is hereby established as a body politic
 and an incorporated town as provided by law within
 the territorial limits set out in the petition, said bound-
 ary is as follows:

Situated in Floyd County Kentucky at the mouth
 of Steels Creek of Right Beaver and Beginning at two
 large sycamores twenty (20) feet south of Steel Creek
 corner of Tract 126 (Blkhorn Fuel Company mineral)
 and Tract 1152 (Blkhorn Fuel Company fee) thence
 down Steel Creek N 92 42 W eight hundred ninety seven
