IN RE-PETITION ASKING FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT
OF AND INCORPORATION OF A CITY TO BE DESIGNATED
AS WILLISBURG IN WASHINGTON COUNTY, KENTUCKY

J U D G M E N T

This cause coming on to be heard on a petition containing the
metes and bounds to be established into a City, asking or petitioning
the Court to establish a town in Washington County, Kentucky, said
town to be designated as Willisburg, and the territory to be incorporated
C as said City having at least 125 inhabitants residing within the territory
O as provided in K. R. S. 81.030, and said petition having been signed by at
P least two-thirds (2/3) of the voters living within the boundary of the
Y proposed City, and said petition having been filed in the Office of the
Clerk of the Washington Circuit Court on October 4, 1965, which is more
than twenty (20) days as provided in K. R. S. 81.050 before the commence-
ment of the next term of the Washington Circuit Court which convened on
October 25, 1965, and a notice of the filing of said petition and its
object having been published in the Springfield Sun, the only newspaper
published in and for Washington County, Kentucky, said notices having been
published in two issues as provided in K. R. S. 81.050, on October 14, 1965,
and October 21, 1965, and on the second day of the October term of the
Washington Circuit Court no defense having been interposed as provided by
K. R. S. 81.060, and the Court being satisfied that all of the statutory
requirements relative to the establishment of a sixth class town have
been met, the Court is of the opinion that the petitioners have manifested
a right to the relief sought in accordance with the prayer of the petition.

It is therefore ordered and adjudged by the Court that the herein-
after described territory by metes and bounds be established into a
sixth class town, said town to be designated as Willisburg and bounded
and described as follows:

The boundary incorporated into said City of Willisburg is in metes
and bounds as follows:



BEGINNING at a stake on the edge of the right of way of the Spring-
field and Willisburg Highway (said point is located in the fence line of
the Willisburg School Grounds). Thence crossing said School Grounds
passing the South West corner of the chimney of the School House, and
continuing same course which is S 59 E 1671 feet to a stake near the East
side of the road leading to the Gardner Jenkins Farm, in the fence line of
Jenkins and Ree Perkins. Thence S 86 1/2 E 2169 feet to a stake in the
yard fence of Arthur D. Harmon. Thence crossing the Willisburg and
Mackville Highway N 2 W 700 feet to the silo of Byron Goode. Thence
N 6 E 2500 feet to a point in the roadway near the tenant house of Byron
Goode, and continuing same course 1575 feet to make a total of 4075 feet
to a stake on the South side of the drive-way at the rear of the residence
of Charles E. Coulter. Thence N 10 W 1540 feet to a stake in the East
side of the yard of Charles Stine. Thence S 50 1/2 W 1092 feet to a
stake on the edge of the right of way of the Willisburg and Tatum Springs
road. Thence crossing road S 32 1/4 W 4727 feet to center of the tobacco
barn of R. C. Riley, and continuing same course 693 feet to make a total
of 5420 feet to the point of Beginning, containing 317.93 Acres, according
to survey made by James Goatley on August 13, 1965.

It is further ordered and adjudged by the Court pursuant to and in conformity with K. R. S. 81.060, that Darrol Foster, Joe S. Perkins, Gardner Jenkins, Charles Colvin, and H. T. Coulter, five citizens, who live within the above described area, be and they are hereby appointed trustees for said town; and that E. R. Jenkins, who is also a citizen of said above described area, be and he is hereby appointed Police Judge; and that Arthur Harmon, Jr., who is also a citizen of the said above described area, be and he is hereby appointed as Marshal; and that William Griffey, who is also a citizen of said above described area, be and he is hereby appointed as Assessor, all of said Officers shall hold their respective Office until the next election at which Officers for Cities and Towns may be elected.

It is further ordered and adjudged by the Court pursuant to and in conformity with K. R. S. 81.060, that Cecil McMillin, Clerk of the Washington Circuit Court shall not later than ten (10) days after the entry of this Judgment, send a certified copy thereof to the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky at Frankfort, Kentucky, whose duty it shall be to properly index and file same as a permanent record in his office.
