JUDGMENT

AT A COURT HELD THE 10TH OF MARCH, 1955

This cause coming on to be heard, and it appearing to the Court from the record herein that due notice of the filing of the complaint and the amended and supplemental complaint herein and the object thereof having been published as required by law, and it further appearing to the Court that the provisions of Chapter 81 of the Kentucky Revised Statutes relating to the incorporation of a municipal corporation have been complied with;

And it further appearing that A. J. Eline, one of the intervenors in this action, filed an original proceeding in the Court of Appeals of Kentucky in the form of a motion for a writ of prohibition following the entry of an opinion by this Court on December 1, 1954, for the purpose of prohibiting this Court from entering a judgment of incorporation;

And it further appearing that under date of January 28, 1955, the Court of Appeals of Kentucky overruled said motion for a writ of prohibition by the said A. J. Eline, and that a mandate to that effect dated March 4, 1955, issued by the Clerk of the Court of Appeals of Kentucky, has been filed in this record, and the Court being sufficiently advised,

IT IS NOW ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

1. That a municipal corporation by the name of Woodlawn Park be and is hereby established as a municipal corporation of the sixth class within the

following described boundary, as more fully shown by the plat filed with the complaint herein, said boundary being described as follows, to wit:

"A tract of land in Jefferson County, Kentucky, more particularly described as follows:

"Beginning at a point in line between Lot 1 and Lot 2, Woodlawn Race Course Subdivision, recorded in Deed Book 166, page 639, in the office of the County Court Clerk of Jefferson County, Kentucky, said beginning point being 60 feet Southeastwardly at right angles from the center line of Westport Road; thence South 38 degrees 15 minutes East along line between Lots 1 and 2 and along line between Lots 7 and 8 of aforesaid subdivision and a Southeast projection of said line, a distance of 1890 feet, more or less, to a point in North right-of-way line of the Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company; thence in an Easterly direction along the North right-of-way line of the Louisville and Nashville Railroad Company a distance of 2070 feet, more or less, to a point; thence North 38 degrees 15 minutes West, crossing Westport Road, a distance of 2640 feet to a point, said point being 60 feet Southeastwardly at right angles from the center line of the Old Westport Road; thence South 49 degrees West, 60 feet Southeastwardly from and parallel to the center line of Old Westport Road and the center line of the present Westport Road, a distance of 1970 feet, more or less, to the point of beginning."

2. There are hereby appointed as the Board of Trustees of said municipal corporation the following named persons, who are residents therein, to wit:

Burns Spear
Wesley M. Caye
Phil Perkins
John Owens
John Kantor

As the Police Judge, Channing W. Daniel; as the City Clerk, Robert Cockerill; as the Treasurer, Lea McIntire; as the Assessor, Harley L. Morgan, and as the Marshal, M. L. White. Each of said Trustees and officials shall hold their respective offices until the next General Election at which officers for cities and towns may be elected, and said Trustees and officials shall continue to serve until their successors have been elected and qualified.

3. The qualifications of said officers shall be in the manner provided

by law, by taking the respective oaths of office and executing the respective bonds and obligations as may be proscribed by law, a record of which is being entered upon the records of said municipal corporation.

4. The Clerk of this Court, in accordance with the provisions of Section 01.060, Kentucky Revised Statutes, shall, within a period of not later than ten days from the entry of this judgment, certify a copy of said judgment to the Secretary of State of the Commonwealth of Kentucky for permanent recording in that office.
